

Remarks

Sunday February 25th 1843

First part blowing strong from the SW heading 34 & 34
at the Fore & Main Topsails & Mainsail with rough
weather at night took in the Mainsail Middle part
more moderate at the Mainsail and shuck out on reef
Latter part quite moderate until in the P.M. boom and
took in the Mainmast Boat at 11 AM took in the P.M.
the P.M. and made all sail with good weather

Latitude of 42.16 S Long 77.20

Monday February 26th

First part moderate wind from the SW heading to the
P.M. with all sail set at 1 PM. After the British Steam
Ship Selamander from Rio Janeiro bound down the
coast Middle part strong wind from SW heading 34
at 1 PM double reef the Topsails Latter part much the
same wind and weather employed in taking up the
Pumps and overhauling them S. Ends

Latitude of 43.37 Long 76.50

Tuesday February 27th

First part strong breeze from the SW with cloudy
weather under double reef heading 34 at night wind
heaved a little backed to the 44 Middle part black
and squally close reef the Topsails & took in the 1st and 2nd
Mainsail Morning strong at 12 midnight backed to the
34 Latter part at the Mainsail still blowing strong from
the SW with rough squally weather & turned up the
mainmast Boat

Latitude of 43.57 Long 76.19

On board Ship *Atina*

Wednesday February 28th 1843

First part blowing strong with squalls from the SW
under close reef Topsails and courses heading the 34 & 34
at night took in the Mainsail Middle part squally
at 1 AM at the Mainsail Latter part moderate made
all sail heading 34 & 34 employed variously

Latitude of 44.2 S Long 75.40

Thursday March 2nd

First part moderate weather with now & then squalls
of fog heading to the 34 with a light breeze from 11 AM
at night took in the P.M. the Masts without a prospect
of a change Middle part backed to the 34
Latter part wind light from the SW with all sail set
heading 34 of the wind employed in mending stove sail

Latitude of 44.43 Long 75.8

Friday March 3rd

First part weather cloudy with a light wind from
the SW heading 34 low night whales Middle part
dark looking weather with a moderate breeze from 44
to South at daylight latter part wind at 44 & 44 courses
44 with a strong wind and a heavy head beat sea
at 10 AM took one reef in the Topsails at noon
close reef the Fore & Main with the ship making
some water caused by a leak around the lower helix
S. Ends with a strong weather & blowing a gale

Latitude of 45.44 Long 76.19
