

Bound Towers

Saturday March 4th 1843

First part blowing a gale of wind from the NW Course
H.W. at 2 PM took in the 1st & Main sail at 4 PM
took in the Fore & Main and close reefed the Main Tails
At night wind hauled to the SW heading SE Middle
part more moderate at the Tails and Main sail
Latter part moderate wind from WSW with all sail out
heaving South Sea started 2 1/2 of Water

Latitude of 46 57 S Long of 76 49

Sunday March 5th

First part moderate wind from WSW heading South
with all sail out weather dark & cloudy
Middle part moderate wind with light squalls from
the West Latter part heading SE wind WSW weather
thick and heavy at 10 AM took in the Tails and
double reefed the Tails at noon took in the 1st

Latitude of 48 30 Long 77 40

Monday March 6th

First part thick heavy weather with a strong wind
and rough sea from the WSW under double reef
Tails steering SE Middle part at 8 PM blowing a gale
took in the Fore & Main Tails and Main sail wind WSW
Latter part blowing a hard gale with heavy squalls from the
WSW took a reef in the Tails heading NW wind SW
at Noon took in the Tails at blowing very hard and
a very high sea running S. Ends

Latitude of 49 40 Long of 78 10

Cape Horn

Tuesday March 7th 1843

First part blowing a heavy gale of wind from the SW
heading NW Towers night more moderate at the Tails
and the Tails again with a heavy sea running
Middle part strong wind from the WSW Course SE
Latter part hefted off SE & S under single reef Tails and
Main Top Fall sail wind at NW with a heavy sea

Latitude of 50 53 South Long 78 50

Wednesday March 8th

First part wind at NW weather thick and squally
Course NW under single reef Tails & Top & Tails
Middle part at 1 PM wind hauled to the WSW Course SE
under close reef Tails blowing strong Latter part hefted
off SE & S took out one reef from the Main Tails
weather very rugged wind strong from WSW Course SE

Latitude of 53 13 Long 79 00

Thursday March 9th 1843

First part blowing strong from the WSW Course SE
under single reef Main Tails double reef Fore & Main
and Course weather very rugged at night double reefed
the Main Tails Middle part at 8 PM took in the Fore &
Main Tails at daylight set them again Latter part calm
with rain and a heavy swell S. Ends

Latitude of 54 45 Long of 80 30

Friday March 10th

First part rain at 4 PM took a reef from the SW
Course SE at 8 PM came on to blow a gale of wind from
the SW took in the Tails & reefed the Tails Middle
part blowing hard in squalls Latter part blowing a heavy gale
with squalls of snow and hail wind SW heading NW
