

Cape Horn

Friday March 10th 1843

40 mth. and

Little part blowing a hard gale of wind from SW with
a heavy sea running and squalls of hail & snow, lying to
under a blow of Main Tarpail and reef Foresail

Latitude of 66 53.21 S. Long 75.23

Saturday March 11th

First part blowing a gale from the SW with considerable
snow and hail at 5 PM more moderate at the Fore &
Main Tarpail. Heft off SC Middle part moderate at
the Main sail at midnight wind at South hauled up
Harp at daylight wind moderate weather fair mass all
hail at 7 AM Latter part very squally clouds over the
Tarpails took in the 1st weather coils with hail & snow

Latitude of 66 55.54 Long 75.40

Sunday March 12th

First part strong wind from SW heading S under
double reef Tarpails with squalls of hail and snow
making very slow headway. For as fast as we hup off the wind
hauled ahead. At night took ship to the SW. Middle part
blow & cold with a strong breeze under double reef.
Latter part at 7 AM took in the 2nd sheet out one reef
hauled and signalled with an American Brig hauled West.

Latitude of 66 55.53 Long 75.49

Monday March 13th

First part wind moderate from SW heading S at 4 PM
mass all sail wind light weather very good, wind ahead
Middle part wind light from the SW. Saw a Comet heading
West with a tail from the horizon to the Zenith.
Latter part took the wind from the SW course S.W.

Latitude of 66 56.00 Long 76.40

Cape Horn

Tuesday March 14th 1843

First part moderate wind from SW course S.W. weather
cloudy with mist at 3 PM took in the Fore & Main
Tarpail at 4 took in the Main with a stiff breeze
at night reefed the Tarpails Middle part fine breeze from SW
at 2 o'clock at the hup off S.W. at daylight saw Diego Ramirez
bearing NW about 20 miles. Sub the lower & topmast that sail
with a fine breeze from SW. So hauled course S.W.

Latitude of 66 56.42 S. Long 67.30

Wednesday March 15th

First part wind moderate from SW course NW. S.W. with
thick rainy weather Middle part at 12 o'clock took the wind
from the S.W. Latter part wind at SW course NW. S.W. with
light squalls, all sail set with a fine breeze

Latitude of 66 56.50 Long 67.00

Thursday March 16th

First part fine breeze from SW course NW. S.W. with
single reef the Tarpails and at the Top Galt sail over them
saw Staten Land bearing NW. Middle part stiff breeze
Latter part wind at West with misty weather. all sail
set at noon carried away the Fore Tarpail that sail Burn

Latitude of 66 Long

Friday March 17th

First part fine wind at West, course NW. with single
up Tarpails and Top & Tail over them saw as they shew
some help Middle part much the same Latter part
wind at SW course NW. S.W. at 11 AM strong wind from SW. S.W.
weather hazy double reef the Tarpails & turned over the Board

Latitude of 66 57.49 Long 58.00
