

Remarks on Board

Tuesday May 30th 1843

First part wind from the N with rain still being at anchors Middle part better weather Latter part much the same S. Ends

Wednesday May 31st

First part took our anchors and went into Newbury at noon Middle part lay by Latter part rainy weather

Thursday May June 1st

First part good weather entered ship at Palmereth and began to discharge our cargo Middle part lay by Latter part discharging

Friday M June 2nd

First part discharging as usual Latter part much the same. S. Ends

Saturday June 3rd

First part discharging Latter part much the same unhooked the sails

Ship Station

Sunday June 4th 1843

First part moving strong with cloudy weather employed in discharging the cargo and unreeving the running rigging Latter part keeping the Sabbath S. Ends

Monday June 5th

First part keeping the Sabbath Latter part finished discharging and gave all hands their discharge for this voyage S. Ends
