Monday 11th Sept 1843.

Came with strong winds from the South
S.E. & the wind to the East - later from
the S.W. and fair
Obs lat 37. 00 Long 28. 25
11th Sept 1843.

Light breeze from the
N. to S.W. and fair & gently Steady E.S.
Lat 37. 51 Long 40. 45

Wednesday 13th Sept.

All these 24 hours very light air from
the West & S.W. inclining to coming Steady
E.S. Obs lat 37. 51 Long 39. 45 20

Thursday 14th Sept 1843.

Commenced with very light air from
the West Middle part - Calm

at 10 AM. a light breeze from the
S.W. Steered E.S. Obs lat 38. 01 Long 39. 00

Friday 15th Sept.

Came with gentle breeze from the S.W.
Steering East middle and latter part
fresh breeze and passing Clouds

Obs lat 39. 04 Long 35. 13 20

Saturday 16th Sept

All these 24 hours fresh breeze from S.W.

to N.W. and Squally Steady E.S. & S.E.

Obs lat 39. 32 N Long 32. 00 O.L. 37. 44 20

Sunday 17th Sept

All these 24 hours fresh Windy from
N.W. to N.W.W. at 8 P.M. took in Squall and
at 3 P.M. hauled off S.E. Saw 2 large
or 40 passed to leeward of the Island
Saw 2 large heavy in for the land or 100 yards
the middle of 2 large S.W. N 20 N.W. 20

Voyage On Board Ship Statira of N Bedford 1843

Monday 11th Sept 1843.

Fine breeze from the N.W. Steady S.E. & E.
Floris in Light a Stern at 10 AM. hauled
Dyab at 11 So hauled off at 1 PM. headed in
at 11 So went on Shore at 2 PM. got
no besides potatoes no among corn or other
Vegetables So every thing off and on at
Floris

Tuesday 12th Sept

hauled off Dyab at 7 PM. with all aboard
and started for the Cape de Verdy Island
Steered S.W. Middle and latter part
Fine breeze and fair weather and Ship
in Light Lat. Obs. 37. 20 Long 28. 08 20

Wednesday 20th Sept 1843.

Commenced with fine breeze from the
North at 3 PM. Spoke Ship Hamilton from
Pag Harbor Bound to the N.W. Coast

Shipped a Portuguese out of the Hamilton
Middle and latter part Squally with Rain
Wind at 10 AM. the Campas principally
from the E.S.E. So every Ship Hamilton
in Light a Stern Lat Obs 35. 33 N Long 27. 16

Thursday 21st Sept 1843.

Wind from the S.E. and Squally by the
wind to the S.W. at 5 P.M. had a very heavy
Squall from the S.E. and wind hauled to the
S.W. more Ship to the S.E. Clear reefed top Sails
later part Steady windy from S.W. and
Squally by the wind to the S.E. at 11 PM. in
Sight off Lee beam heavy to the S.E.

Obs Lat 35. 16 Long 27. 30 20
