

Journal of a Voyage Towards the West

Saturday 15th Oct 1843.

All these 24 hours light bafflen windy and plenty of squalls of rain. Working to the South in Co with Ship Gora of St Johns N.B. lat by alt 7.25 long 50.15

Sunday 16th Oct 1843.

These 24 hours is attended with light bafflen winds and squalls with heavy rain at 10 P.M. passed a ship bound to the North to Enay with Canvas & Sail in sight Obs lat 7.17 long 50.24 W

Monday 17th October 1843.

These 24 hours is attended with light air from the S.E. and Calms at 2 P.M. Spoke a Brig from Cape of Good Hope bound to London to Enay with Canvas the ship Gora and two other Ships in sight Lat Obs 7.03 long 50.36

Tuesday 18th

All these 24 hours Calms with some light squalls with rain two Ships in sight bound to the South. Lat by alt 6.02 long 50.49

Wednesday 19th

Commences with Calms at 10 P.M. a Breeze from the S.E. by the wind to the S.W. latter part somewhat squally and sailing light off has been Obs lat 5.14 W long 50.54

Thursday 19th

Commences with Moderate breezes from the South by the wind to the N.W. at 6 P.M. tacked to the Eastward latter part squally with rain two Ships in sight or 12 Meridian tacked to the N.W. Lat Obs 5.23 long 50.36 W

Remarks on Friday 20th October.

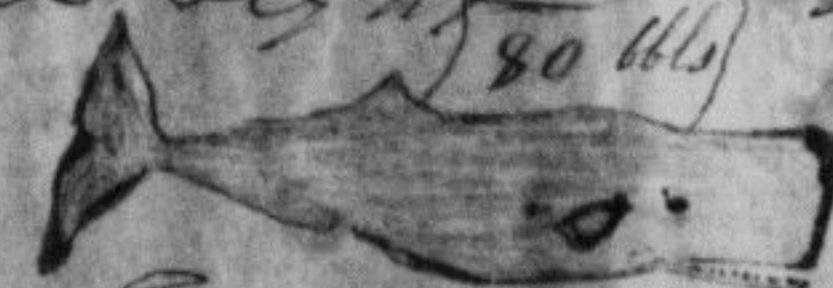
Cornes with light bafflen Windy by the wind to the West. Missa and latter part light bafflen winds and plenty of rain with a swell from the South two Ships in sight bound to the South Lat 4.18 S

Saturday 21st October

Light bafflen winds with Rain squalls and a swell from the South two Ships in sight making very slow progress to the South Lat by alt 5.55 long 50.19.00

Sunday 22nd October

Fine breezy from 9 to 5 P.M. by the wind to the S.E. at 3 P.M. lowered for a sperm whale at 10 to fastened to Enay wheat and Ship in sight Lat 5.27 long 50.17



Monday 23rd Oct 1843.

Cornes with fresh breezy from the South at 3 P.M. took a whale to the Ship and exp. parts so hooked on now round the whale to leeward at Enay on quit cutting. Muzzle part fresh comes from the South and slightly at daylight began to cut or 12 Meridian had the head off and Bodey in to Enay cutting

Tuesday 24th Oct 5.44 N long 50.55 W

Cornes with light airs from the S.W. and squally or Rain at 4 P.M. had the junk in and Cois bailed more Ship head to the S.E. and began to boil but it soon came in to Rain so had to Cool down at 10. Midnight began to boil a game but had to stop after in consequence of Rain heated an appearance took working to the South in progress Bodey and Barque in sight Lat by alt 5.58 N long alt 57.00
