Tuesday 5th March 1844.

Fine breeze from the N.E. Steering N.W. by S. Sun
fine clear 1st Log 155 N. Log 140 23 N

Wednesday 6th

All these 24 hours fine breeze from N.E. Steering
N.W. by S. employed at sundown 804 a low
the ship 1st Log 170 N. Log 155 23 N

Thursday 7th March 1844.

Fine breeze from N.E. latter part somewhat
Squally Steering N.W. 1st Log 183 N. Log 168 50 N

Friday 8th March

All these 24 hours fine breeze from East
to E.S.E. and rain squally Steering N.W. by S.
of which 80000 4.30 P.M. so early with squally
1st Log 190 N. Log 175 43 N

Saturday 9th March 1844.

Came with wind from E and squally
Steering West at 7 P.M. made the East point of
Achille at 10. Minster Mountain Peak came in sight
since the Oboroa mts to be 1.50 miles to far to the
East by Lunar Distance and by the Land
1st Log 200 N. Log 185 40 N

Sunday 10th March 1844.

Strong wind from East Steering N.W. by S.
land in sight at 9 A.M. Entered the harbour
and proceeded to make at 9 P.M. came to anchor
in 10 fathom water of Ranier -

Monday 11th March 1844

Commenced with fine lead at 11 A.M.
took our anchor from home and proceeded for
Pawloo at P.M. made water by 6 Throes & the
night at 7 A.M. came to anchor in 10 fathom
water on shore in presence of numerous vessels
short which had been ordered -

Onward Ship Station of N.B. Coast 1844.

Thursday 28th March

Commenced with bofferen winds at 5 P.M. got
my crew on board at 4 P.M. This ship and
Ship Broganza came to anchor - Carea a very
the Brigganza Martingale and store a new
Boat - very bad which we had over the stern
at 10 A.M. the wind Breeze took over - and
from Moha and proceeded to the
Barrage for the N.W. - to Eney

Friday 29th March

Moderate wind from the N.E. ship heading
to the N in Co with Ship Agnes and
Potest at 11 A.M. hauled to N.W. by S. made
also at 10 A.M. spoke Ship Patriot - at 10. made
the middle of Achille Port South 10 or 12 miles distant

Saturday 30th March 1844.

Came with fine breeze from the N.E. Steering
N.W. - Ship Patriot in Co.
Middle and latter part much the same Ship
Patriot - still in Co. Steering N.W.
1st Log 210 N. Log 195 40 N

Sunday 31st March 1844

Light breeze from the N.E. to E Steering N.W.
Ship Patriot in Co so early with gentle breeze
from E and fair weather 1st Log 220 N. Log 205 50 N

Monday - April 1st 1844

Fine breeze from the E and fair weather
Steering N.W. Ship Patriot in Co.
at 6 A.M. took in the stowen boat and commenced
Repairing her - painted water boat - &c. by 6 P.M. 1st Log 230 N. Log 215 50 N

Tuesday 2nd March 1844.

Moderate breeze from the N.W. to South
Steering N.W. Middle and latter part
light bofferen winds and fog squally
Ship Patriot in sight a few
1st Log 240 N. Log 225 50 N
