Saturday 13th April

Light air from the South and fair weather
at 4 P.M. saw wholly as Collier right wholly
at 5.20 were to the W. employed Boiling or-4-4-4-4
were to the S.E. made sail to Envy employed
Boiling Repairing, Craped the Boim and repairing
Quint-Boat - ob. Lat 33.51 Long 171.52 W

Sunday 14th

Moderate breeze from the South by the wind to
the S.E. Boiling and repairing a Boat
at 1 P.M. were Ship to the West under Short
Sail a sailing saw and Finback
(C) Lat 32.20 Long 171.45 W

Monday 15th

All these 24 hours heavy Rain light air from the S.W.
and cloudy. Stowed down a heavy 9 Boil with
saw and Finback headed to the S.E. at 4.40
were Ship to the West on a heavy 9 Boil
Boiling - - - Lat 32.20 Long 171.45 W

Tuesday 16th April

Came with moderate breeze from the S.W.
by the wind to the S.W. 8 minutes and left
past strong winds from the S.W. and
passing cloudy double rised up sails
steamed down the Reman and of 2nd oil
making 100 lbs to 200 lbs of 200 lbs to the

Wed 17th

First wind from the S.W. by the wind to
the W.S.W. at 4 P.M. were Ship to the S.E.
middle part strong winds and heavy

Remarks On Thursday 18th April

All these 24 hours strong winds from the
S.W. by the wind to the S.E. at 4 P.M. tacked to the
W. N.W. later part strong winds and heavy
under Short Sail by the wind employed Repairing
a 200 lb Boat - ob. Lat 34.08 Long 178.33 W

Friday 19th April 1844

Strong winds from the West and thick by the
wind to the S.W. under Short Sail at 10 P.M.
headed to the S.W. thick & rainy later part
quite moderate and somewhat thick by the wind to the
S.W. employed Repairing a boat ob. Lat 34.08 Long 178.33 W

Saturday 20th April

Moderate breeze from the W. and heavy by the
wind to the S.W. at 1 P.M. lowered for a 200 lb
whole with no success, going through the night
at 1.40 lowered a gun with the same result
later part light air from the S.E. thick & rainy
a swell from the W. strong W. - ob. Lat 33.40 Long 179.35 W
thick and rainy

Sunday 21st

Came with light air from the E and thick
rainy strong W. under Short Sail at 9 P.M.
Wind hauled to W. because by the wind to the S.W. 4.40
later part strong winds and heavy headed 11.40
New York ob. Lat 33.40 Long 179.35 W

Light air from the West by the wind to the S.W.
at 4 P.M. Spoke Ship Sires 30 minutes and
ob. headed to the S.E. through the night to 2.40
Lat 33.40 Long 179.45 W

Tuesday 23rd April

Heavy light air from the S.W. at 8 P.M. were to the
West - light air and going through the night
later part fine breeze from the South headed 11.40
two Ships in sight ob. Lat 33.20 Long 178.40 E
C.L. 177.15 E
