

Journal of a voyage to Lamskatae on board
 Remarks on ^{Monday} Thursday 24th April 1844
 Came with fine breeze from the South
 Steering NW by W. and Ship in sight
 at 1 P.M. Shortened sail hauled by the wind
 to the W. as we were ship to the S.E. and do
 wind hauled to the N in a severe breeze to
 the W. at 1 P.M. Run off spoke Daniel Webster
 4 Whales lost at 3 P.M. Long 178.00 m

Thursday 25th April 1844
 Came with rather thick weather wind N.E. & E. in the forenoon
 then clearing to the NW. Middle part cloudy and thick
 with rain or rather sleet N.E. & E. wind South
 So Ends with wind S.W. and C. Lowly Daniel Webster
 in sight off land a run 100 by 34.18 Long 178.31 E

Friday 26th April
 Commenced with fine breeze from the S.W.
 Steering N.E. Ship I Boston in sight at 5 P.M. it
 shot in thick weather sail hauled to the South
 at 10 wind hauled to the W. NW and then strong
 at 1 P.M. were to the North on 3 do lowered fore sail
 Cleared paper main top sail and seen
 four by 34.14 Long 179.20 E

Saturday 27th April
 All these 24 hours strong gale from the N.W. and
 and heavy squalls going to head to the N.E. to N.W.
 at 2 P.M. 2nd paper fore sail at 7 P.M. were round
 to the NW at 10 do 3rd double reefed top sail so every
 with strong wind and squalls 34.30 Long 179.45 E

Sunday 28th April 1844
 Came with fresh breeze from the NW by the
 corn to the NW by the latter part moderate at 10 P.M.
 Spoke Ship South Boston 180066
 Cutting a Whale so every with light air
 from the NW. Lost 06 34.30 Long 178.50 m

Ship Stada of New Bedford & S. Adams 1844
 Monday 29th April
 Came with light air from the NW
 Air from the NW by the latter head to the
 NW by Ship I Boston in C. at Boiling
 06 34.18 Long 179.09 E

Tuesday 30th April
 Came with light air from the North
 heavy to the NW middle and last part
 Wind N.N.E. Steer to the NW & Ship in
 sight at 10 P.M. at Boiling
 06 34.18 Long 179.31 E

Wednesday 1st May
 Moderate breeze from the N.E. and fair weather
 Steering NW by W. at 5 P.M. saw two Right Whales
 that the ship Boats was chased at 1 P.M. Run off
 Spoke Ship Heroine 105086 a long head to
 the NW through the N.E. at 7 P.M. E. by Ship in
 sight so every heading to the NW 34.27 Long 179.50 E

Thursday 2nd May
 All these 24 hours very light air hazy and every
 at 5 P.M. toward for a whale a ship had been chased
 at 7 P.M. toward and chased two Whales in C.
 with two other ships & 12 boats & every but lower not
 at 11 P.M. saw 30 every with every then ship in
 sight 34.35 Long 177.00 m

Friday 3rd May
 All these 24 hours very light air from the
 East and fair weather heading to the NW by
 3 Ships in sight 34.35 Long 177.10 E

Saturday 4th May
 All these 24 hours light air from S.E. to N.W. heading
 to the NW at 3 P.M. caught a very large turtle which
 made 15 gallons of oil at 11 P.M. toward and killed
 an Right Whale and a calf took the Cow to the ship
 so every two ship in sight 34.20 Long 178.25 E
