

Journal of a Voyage to Haintsotha and
Remarks on Wednesday 15th May 1844.

All these 24 hours wind from S to ESE and thick
staying to the S.W. under short sail at 4 P.M.
Saw a great number of extraordinary large
Grampings as it is called up saw three
Right Whales but it soon shot in thick fog
and could not follow. Lat 43.45 Long 118.15 E

Thursday 16th May

Very thick fog wind from the E heading to the
N.W. under short sail. Heaved to the N.W. under
short sail at 12 M. and were wind to the South
Wind from S.E. to South and very thick fog
with some rain. 2 Eury by head to the N.W. and South

Lat by alt 44.15 N Long 119.32 E

Friday 17th May

All these 24 hours strong gale and thick heading
to the S.W. under short sail at 1 P.M. Wind S.W.
to N.W. under S.W. to S. at 10 A.M. it lighted up
and moderated a little but short sail was kept
top sail & fore sail. Saw a number of Whales
to thick and heavy 2 to fore Lat 43.45 Long 119.30 W

Saturday 18th May

All this 24 hours strong gale from N.W. heading
to the S to S.W. at 4 P.M. close reefed
all top sail and kept fore sail at 7 P.M.
putted fore sail at 1 P.M. split down top sail
hauled in down to the fore part of main
top sail very heavy snow and snow on
sea Lat by alt 44.10 N Long 120.15 E

Sunday 19th May

Came with heavy gale from the N.W. heading to the
to the S.W. at 5 P.M. under ship to the S.W. to N.W.
lost part more moderate at 8 P.M. were to the
N.E. and made sail but a new fore top
stay sail Lat by alt 43.58 N Long 119.10 E

Ship Station of New Bedford 1844.

Monday 20th May

Wind from the N.W. heading to the S.W.
at 5 P.M. lowered for a whole. Parted but
could not further headed to the S.W. through.
The night very light air, little part heavy
at 10 P.M. Coward killed and sunk a whale
to Eury with very light air and heavy

Lat 45.23 N Long 118.35 E

Tuesday 21st May

Very light air from the S and heavy
heading to the N.W. middle and little part
Moderate breeze from S.E. and fair weather or more
toward further to a whole the grain broke
and lost the whole so Eury with moderate
breeze and fair weather. Under main top sail
Prepared to sea Best of Lat 45.45 E

Wednesday 22nd May

Moderate breeze from the South and fair
at 4 P.M. saw a number of Whales further
to sea but saw to cut from him could not follow
middle part strong wind from the South and
thick headed to the S.E. at 2 P.M. were ship to the
West at 10 A.M. it lighted up so Eury with
strong wind from the S.W. under double
reefed top sail Lat 45.05 N Long 118.00 W

Thursday 23rd May

Strong winds from the S.W. and heavy
heading to the S.W. middle and little part
Moderate breeze from S.W. and foggy squally at 1 P.M.
tacked to the S.E. at 11 P.M. thick heavy
Lat by alt 44.25 N Long 117.25 E

Friday 24th May

Strong wind from the N. and thick heading to the S.W.
at 3 P.M. tacked to the S.W. at 5 A.M. made sail to the
N.W. Wind N.W. at 9 P.M. further to a whole
and parted to Eury. One heard but the light
Lat 43.58 N Long 116.00 E
