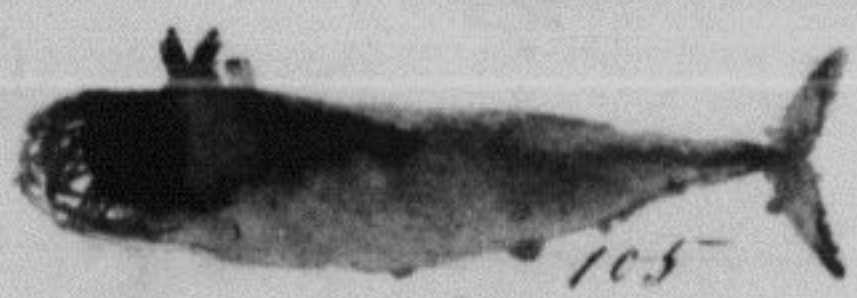


Journal of a voyage to Nantucket anchored

Tuesday 25th June 1844.

Light air from the North and thick fog
employed stowing in oil at 8 P.M. pushed
Boiling Middle and latter part thick stowed
down the remainder of the oil

Lat 46° 45' N Long 166° 19' E



Wednesday 26th June

Moderate breeze from the West at 2 P.M. finished
stowing down at 4 P.M. lowered for whale
at 7 P.M. took a whale to the ship at 8 P.M. hooked
on or 10 do had him in one ship in sight
Sounded by the Chime so early with 200

Lat 46° 45' N Long

Thursday 27th June

Came with light air from the South heaved
to the N.E. at 4 P.M. saw ship Chime took a whale
more ship to the S.E. latter part wind from
the N.E. and rain employed Boiling
at 12 M. down were to the N.W.

Lat 46° 10' N Long 166° 30' E

Friday 28th June

These 24 hours is attended with strong gales
from the N.E. to N. part part thick and rain
employed boiling headed to the N.W. at 10 do
were 10 do to the E. do took in foresail and
stopped boiling latter part cloudy & rain
rain with strong wind (Came to the ship at
10 P.M. Lat 46° 50' N Long 166° 15' E.

Saturday 29th June

Strong gales from the North and thick
head 2 E.N.E. under short sail. Boiling.

Middle and latter part more moderate

Stowed down 100 bbls N.E. so early with strong wind
from the North heaved to N.E.

No. 11 tales

Lat 46° 41' N Long 166° 45' E

Ship Statia of N. York 1844.

Sunday 30th June

Fresh winds from the North and rain
thick heading to the N.E. under short sail employed
stowing down at 4 P.M. spoke ship (Chime
Middle and latter part Calm employed stowing
in to pipes between decks and repairing a boat
Ship Chime in Co. Lat 45° 40' N Long 166° 35' E.

Monday 1st July 1844

Light air from the N.E. heading to the N.W.
Middle and latter part the same day light
air from the N.W. S.E. and rain thick
employed repairing boat and setting up shoots
heading to the N.W. by the wind ship Chime in sight
No. 11 tales

Lat 46° 45' N Long

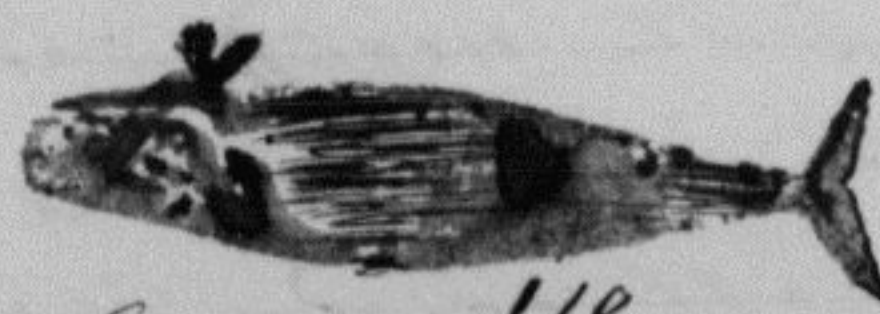
Tuesday 2nd July

Light air from the N.E. and cloudy 6th
wind to the N.W. latter part Calm and pleasant
employed or various jobs. Ship Chime in sight
to the N.W. Lat 46° 35' N Long 166° 55' E.

Wednesday 3rd July 1844.

Came with Calm and cloudy down looking
ground at 3 P.M. lowered for two whales at 10 do
took one of them to the ship at 12 M. down had
him in so early with Calm two ships in sight

Lat 46° 40' N Long 166° 50' E.



Thursday 4th July 1844.

Light air from the N.W. and fair weather
heading to the N.W. and Calm Boiling.

Middle and latter part moderate breeze and rain
thick at 10 A.M. lowered for two whales at 10 M. down
took one large whale to the ship so early with
light air from the N.W. 2 and Calm

Lat 46° 55' N Long 166° 25' E.
