

Journal From Newcastle Towards New Zealand
Oct Friday 25th

Came with Collins at 9 AM took our
Anchor at Newcastle and proceeded to sea
Bound to New Zealand with a complement
of 39 men all told Bargee followed in
Co. or 12 meridian was in the Bargee passage

Saturday 26th Oct 1846.

These 24 hours is attended with light air
and early bad irregular sea heading from
South to S.W. Lat 35° 33' Long 157° 00' W

Sunday 27th October

Strong winds from E to S.W. and bad sea
By the wind to the S.W. under double reefed
top sails Lat 35° 15' N Long 156° 30' W

Monday 28th October

Strong winds from E to S.W. and rough by the
wind to the S.W. employed repairing and painting
Boats &c Lat 35° 35' Long 157° 30' W

Tuesday 29th

Strong winds from E to S.W. by the wind to the
S.W. employed repairing and painting Boats
Oct Lat 35° 15' Long 158° 35' W

Wednesday 30th Oct

Weak winds from the East by the wind to the S.W.
to S.W. Slightly weather Lat 34° 03' Long 158° 15' W

Thursday 31st Oct

These 24 hours is attended with fresh winds from
E to S.W. and S.W. with rain by the wind to the S.W.
took in water boat and put out anchor

Lat 33° 00' Long 157° 45' E

On board Ship Statira of New Bedford. 1846
Friday 1st Nov 1846

Fresh winds from the E to S.W. and rain squally
by the wind to the S.W. employed at sundown 2 PM
a boat the Ship Lat 35° 11' 45" Long 154° 05' 46" W
157° 12' 00" E

Saturday 2nd Nov 1846.

Came with Squalls from E to S.W. by the wind to the
S.W. and P.M. were ship Lat 35° 11' 45" N Long 154° 05' 46" W

Middle part strong winds and squally
bottom part more moderate unless for 1/2 hour
top sails to repair and haul down

Lat 35° 11' 45" Long 154° 05' 46" W

Sunday 3rd Nov 1846

All these 24 hours squally by the wind to the
S.W. so long fresh breeze from E to S.W. and squally
Lat 35° 11' 45" Long 154° 05' 46" W

Monday 4th Nov 1846

Light winds and squalls of rain by the wind
heading from S.W. to S.E. Lat 35° 11' 45" Long 154° 05' 46" W

Tuesday 5th Nov

Light winds from E to S.W. and squally
by the wind to the S.W. employed at sundown 2 PM
Gaily making up the boat &c Lat 35° 11' 45" Long 154° 05' 46" W

Wed 6th Nov

All these 24 hours light winds from the East
and light squally by the wind to the S.W.
Lat 35° 11' 45" Long 154° 05' 46" W

Thursday 7th

Moderate breeze from the E to S.W. by the wind to the S.W.
employed repairing sails &c Lat 35° 11' 45" Long 154° 05' 46" W
