Saturday 23rd Nov. 1846.

These 24 hours is attended with light-wind
and variable with thick Rainy weather
heading to the South Lat 24.17 Long 154.23 W

Sunday 24th Nov.

All these 24 hours variable winds and plenty
of Rain heading S.W. at 12 Mid night made
Nangaea Island Burying S.W. at 10. A wide
Nangaea Island Bury S.W. at 20 Miles Dist
{ Find the Chain to be tied to Lat 26.12 Long 154.60 W
far to the Eastward of this Island
What is if the Island be correct
which I dare much doubt

Monday 25th Nov. 1846.

All these 24 hours Moderate breeze from the S.E.
and fair weather by the wind to the S.W.
employed at Sunday got a boat the ship
Lat 23.20 Long 157.58 W

Tuesday 26th Nov.

All these 24 hours light-wind from the North.
and pleasant Steady S.W. wind - for
main sail and beam a new one
Lat 24.57 Long 158.18 W

Wednesday 27th Nov.

Wind from N.W. to S.W. heading to the South
unlaid, main top sail repaired in and
Beam in again unlaid main top sail
and beam another bottom part of yacht
Lat 27.03 S Long 158.28 W

Thursday 28th Nov.

Strong winds from N.W. to S.W. at 1 P.M.
Cable reefed top sail at 7.45 Glass rose
Main top sail furled foresail hoisted
Squally with heavy sea Lat 27.38 Long 158.57

New Zealand Onboard Ship. Hattera of 13th Dec 1846

Friday 29th Nov. 1846.

Came with strong gaily and Ray Rong 2
hoisted mast up & turned them up. Store
waist - Boat - bottom part light-wind from
the S.W. by the wind to the S.E. employed
at Sunday got repairing waist - Boat &c
Lat 28.26 S Long 158.10 W

Saturday 30th Nov. 1846.

All these 24 hours moderate breeze from
S.E. with a swell from the S.W.
by the wind to the S.W. Lat 29.00 W

Sunday 1st December.

All these 24 hours gentle breeze from
the East Steady S.W. at 4 P.M. got
top mast Steady Sail to end with wind
from East and heavy sea from the South
Lat 30.57 Long 158.19 W
O.D. 159.50 W

Monday 2nd Dec. 1846.

These 24 hours is attended with fine breeze
from S to N.E. and fair weather Steady S.W.
With all sail set to the best advantage
Lat 33.30 Long 160.00 W

Tuesday 3rd Dec. 1846.

Fine breeze from the N.E. Steady South unlaid
Fore top sail and foresail best stay
Lat 36.00 S Long 160.50 W
O.D. 161.57

Wednesday 4th Dec.

All these 24 hours fine breeze from the
N.W.E. latter part Rough strong wind and
Cloudy Rainy S.W. Lat 40.45 Long 161.25 W
