

Journal of a passage from Sandwich

Thursday 5th Dec 1844.

Fresh gale from the North strong South-
or 1 P.M. Very heavy squally and Rain
took in full Run South under short
Sail latter part more moderate and
NW 1st 4.1.17.8 Log 42.10 1/2 13.12.7

Friday 6th Dec 1844.

Moderate breeze from the W to NW 7 heading
to the South headed to the South through
the night under short sail some land
foggy and plenty of birds

1st 4.2.58 Log 41.17.7
10.12.36 1/2

Saturday 7th Dec

Wind from North strong S. or S.W. under
short sail headed to the South W through
the night or day light, under sail
steered S.W. latter part strong gale
from the W.N.W. or S.W. 1/2, parted fore sail
Close reefed main top sail so easy with
strong gale from the W and fresh
1st 4.3.17 Log 1/3.20.

Sunday 8th Dec

Heavy gale from the NW 1/2, headed to the
NW latter part more moderate and squally
of Rain or 8 A.M. spoke Barge Gun

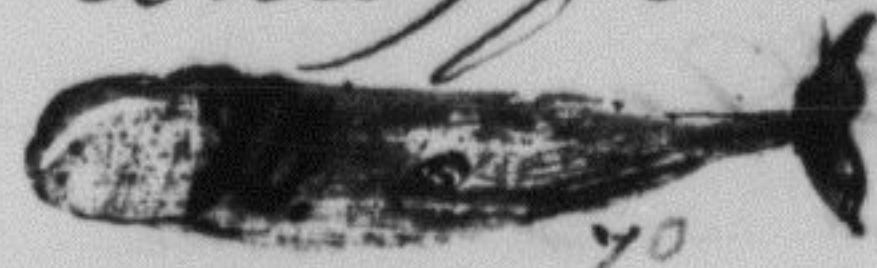
Monday 9th

Strong gale from the North and very squally
and hoisted three S.W. Barge Gun in Co
or 9 A.M. headed to the W
1st 4.5.18 Log 4.5.18

Standby Toward N. Zealand in Ship Station

Tuesday 10th Dec 1844.

Came with strong gale from the North
by head to the W or S.W. Steered S.W.
Ship Gun in light at 10 A.M. landed
for a Right Whale so easy with strong
coming from the S.E. and squally
1st 4.6.19 Log 4.6.19



Wednesday

Strong wind from the E. and Rouse and
Squally or 1/2 P.M. 5 P.M. took a whole
day's haul very rough and heavy under
the whole for last weather. Barge Gun
in light. Very rough through the night at
sunrise were round took the whole to land
and cut him in but lost the head Barge
Gun in light an anchor been landed at
W 6th wind and came boiling 1st 4.7.20

Thursday 13th Dec 1844.

Wind South heading to the West under
short sail Boiling. Middle and latter
part very light air from the South or 1/2 P.M.
were round to the S.E. Made sail
1st 4.8.21 Log 4.8.21

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Friday 13th Dec

Very light air from the South and fair weather
by the wind to the S.E. employed boiling
at 1 P.M. finished boiling, at 5 P.M. broke smooth
oil between fore and main hatch and covered
it found one pipe stove and about air
out or 3 P.M. were round to the South
wind S.E. and rough 1st 4.9.22 Log 4.9.22

Saturday 14th Dec 1844

Strong gale from the S.E. and rough or 1/2 P.M.
about the South and parted fore sail.
under and latter part strong gale and squally
steered S.W. 1/2 P.M. so easy strong gale from the S.E.
very low. headed to the South 1st 4.10.23 Log 4.10.23
