Tuesday 15th May 1845.

These 24 hours variable wind and with
wind principally from the North
Working to the N.E. Lat by 55° 33' Long 133°

Wednesday 16th May 1845.

All these 24 hours wind from N.W. to N.
and something thick by the wind to the
N.E. Lat past 1st Meridian

Lat by 55° 33' Long 133°

Thursday 17th May.

Wind from N.W. by the wind to the N.E.
Middle and latter part squally wind
from N.W. to N.N.W. Strong N.E.

Lat 55° 33' Long 133°

Friday 18th May.

First part Wind from N.W. and cloudy
Middle and latter part strong gale from
N.W. heavy thick heading to the N.E. under
Short Sail at 10 Meridian furler fore and
main Top-sails Lat by 55° 33' Long 133° 30'

Saturday 19th May.

Commenced with strong gale from N.W. and
thick heading N.E. under Double Reefed
Main Top-sail for sail then from
at 4 P.M. the wind hauled to N. Steered N.E. W.
at 9 A.M. had a most tremendous hail
Squall hole strong full the size of Bullets
So Easy with strong gale from N.W. and
Squally heavy N.E. under Short-Sail
Lat 55° 20' Long 133° 30'

Sunday 20th

Commenced with strong gale from N.W. to
N.N.W. heading to the N.E. under Short Sail.
at 7 P.M. wind hauled to N.W. and W.
latter part more moderate wind
W. at 10 Meridian Spoke Bargue Here
from Obidien for Dofrao Lat 55° 16' Long 133° 30'

Monday 19th May 1845.

Gentle breeze from W. by the wind to the
Wind to the North. Middle and latter part
bush winds from the N.W. to N. - at 6 P.M.
tacked to the W. N.W. to end with strong
windy from the W. and N.W. Double Reef
Top-sails at 10 Meridian Tacked to N.E.

Lat 55° 10' Long 132° 00'

Tuesday 20th May.

All these 24 hours steady windy from
W. to N.W. and squally by the wind to the
North and N.E. under Short Sail.

Lat 55° 34' Long 131° 40'

Wednesday 21st

Commenced with squally weather and N.W.
heading to the N. under Short Sail
at 7 P.M. very heavy squally with thunder
how too headed for N.E. to N. Lat past
wind hauled to S.W. blow heavy in
squally with hail Steered N.E. W. under Short
Sail Lat 55° 54' Long 130° 30' W.

Thursday 22nd

Strong gale from S.W. Steady W. N.W.
under Short Sail a day sea from W.N.W.
Middle and latter part strong windy
from S.W. to W.N.W. and heavy squally
heading to the North under Short Sail

Lat 55° 28' Long 129° 40'

Friday 23rd

All these 24 hours strong gale from S.W.
to W. and day heavy squally with hail
strong N.W. to N.E. very rough weather
at 10 Lat 55° 49' Long 128° 30' W.
