

Journal of a voyage from New Zealand
Remarks on Saturday 26th May 1845
All these 26 hours strong winds from the N.W.
first part squally strong N.W. & N.E.
at 11 P.M. put the larboard Boats on the
beam. Lat 42° 33' S Long 48° 45' W

Sunday 27th May
Commenced with fresh winds from the N.W. and
squalls at sundown shortened
sail - latter part boisterous winds and some
rain working to the North put a New Boat
overboard Starboard Boats Lat 42° 30' S Long 48° 20' W

Monday 28th May
Came with boisterous winds and being
heavily to the N.W. by the wind - at 4 P.M.
the wind hauled to the E. and S.E.
Middle and latter part strong gales from S.E.
and heavy squalls and thick steam N.W.
Lat 39° 06' S Long 47° 30' W

Tuesday 29th May 1845
Came with wind from the S.E. and Rain
strong N.W. - Middle part Calm latter
part Wind E. to S.E. and heavy rain
at 11 P.M. wind hauled to N.W. & cleared
up and blew heavy Rain N.W. & N.E.
Lat 38° 10' S Long 46° 08' W

Wednesday 30th May
Came with strong gales from the N.W.
at 4 P.M. it came on to blow very heavy
and most tremendous squally
took in Starboard Boats at 5 P.M. and
was obliged to furl main top sail
latter part rather more moderate
Rain off N.W. under short sail
Lat 37° 15' S Long 44° 00' W

Thursday 31st May
Came with fresh winds from the N.W.
and squally strong N.W. - latter part
more moderate wind from N.W.
strong N.W. & N.E. Lat 35° 25' S Long 40° 00' W

Friday 30th May
Came with light winds from the N.W. and
Rain - middle part Calm - latter part
Wind S.W. and fair weather strong N.E. & N.
Lat 34° 30' S Long 43° 30' W
Saturday 31st May
Wind from South strong N.E. Middle and
latter part wind E. and N.E. by the wind
to the North put out Waist Boat
and went to the South Lat 32° 23' S Long 42° 05' W

Sunday 1st June 1845
Fresh breezes from the E.N.E. to N.E. & N. by the
wind to the N. at 6 P.M. tacked to E.N.E.
latter part fresh winds from N.E. and
cloudy heavily E.S. & E.E. under double
Reefed topsails Long 41° 30' S Long 41° 00' W

Monday 2nd June
All these 26 hours wind from N. to N.E. by the wind
to the E. & E.S. so strong with light air from N.E.
Lat 33° 00' S Long 40° 15' W

Tuesday 3rd June
Came with light airs from the N.N.E. and
cloudy by the wind to the East -
middle part Calm with rain - latter
part light airs from the N.N.E. and fair
weather by the wind to the E. Lat 32° 30' S Long 38° 45' W

Wednesday 4th June
All these 26 hours light airs from the N. to N.E.
and fair weather all sail set by the wind to the
E. sent up Main Royal Mast and yards
Lat 31° 12' S Long 38° 15' W
