Thursday 5th June 1835

All these 24 hours gentle breezes from the N.W. & N.E. by the wind to the E.N.E. & N.E. got up some home and dried it which had got wetter a Round the Holst
Obs Lat 32.42 Long 166.20 W

Friday 6th June 1835

All these 24 hours moderate breezy from N.W. to N.E. and fair weather steering N.E. to N.E. by E
topmasts and top galim steady 2 or 3
Got up some from foreward and dried it
Lat 31.04 Long 166.15 W

Saturday 7th June

Commences with moderate breezy from N.W. and some what cloudy steering N.E.
Middle and latter part day light air from N. to N.W. by the wind to E.N.E. & N.E. got up the
Remainder of the Breeze dried it and 2 or 3
Below Lat 30.03 Long 166.00 W

Sunday 8th June

All 24 hours Wind from the N. to N.W. with passing clouds by the wind to N.E.
Saw a small sea S.E. Lat 29.04 Long 165.32 W

Monday 9th June

Comes with fresh wind from N. & cloudy by the wind N.E. by E. Middle and latter part steering winds and some what squally
at 7 A.M. Repeal top sails so ends by the wind to the E.N.E. Lat 28.00 Long 165.15 W

Tuesday 10th

All these 24 hours strong winds from the North and cloudy by the wind to the E.N.E. and on double Repeal top sails
at 8 A.M. saw a bright Ray E.N.E.
Lat 27.44 Long 165.03 W

Onboard Ship Station of New Bedford 1835
Wednesday 11th June

Winds from N. to N.W. by the wind to the E.N.E. & N.E. at 12 Meridian had a small frame the S.W. Steered N. by E
Lat 27.55 Long 164.00

Thursday 12th June

Came with gentle breezy from the S. and rain - Steered N. - Middle and latter part light air from E. to E.N.E. at 12 Meridian spoke a Barque 50 days from Bremen Bound to Havana showing Signal No. 73.
Lat 27.55 Long 163.12

Friday 13th June

Light air from E.N.E. by the wind to the S.W. Middle and latter part fresh breezy from N. to N.W. at 8 P.M. turned to the E.N.E.
Lat 27.55 Long 162.45
Saturday 14th June

All these 24 hours light air from the N.W. by the wind to the N.E. & N.W. - employed at Sunday got west hole & saw a Ship and bright Steering S.E. Lat 27.55 Long 162.45

Sunday 15th June

These 24 hours is attended with very light air from N.W. to N. and pleasant weather with a swell from S.W. by the wind to the E.N.E. & N.E.
at 8 A.M. saw a Sail bound to the South saw a number of Fish back Lat 27.55 Long 162.55

Monday 16th June

These 24 hours (calm) and lighter working to the North saw a number of Fish back
Lat 27.55 Long 162.00

Tuesday 17th

Came with (calm) latter part light air from N.E. by the wind to the N.W. employed setting the Rigging & saw Sail off the Bremen
Lat 27.55 Long 161.39 W
