November 5. Remarks

Fine weather at 8 a.m. weighed anchor
and went to sea at 11. discharged the
Pilot. at 12 p.m. No more Land born
East 15 miles off.

Wednesday 7th. Comes with heavy weather and
strong N.E. steering S. Easterly
at 6 p.m. double reefed the Topsails the
latter moderated & made sail. 42

Lat. $39^{\circ} 00'$ Long. $70^{\circ} 30'$

Thursday 8th First part foggy with moderate
breeze from N.E. at 2 p.m. wind
hauling to S.E. heading S. westerly took
Ship to S.E. the latter ditto with baffling
wind & squally. 42

Lat $38^{\circ} 30'$ Long $70^{\circ} 05'$

Friday 9th First part squally with much
rain heading to S. Easterly under short
sail, one sail in sight, the latter luffed
too under close reefed No. Topsail, blow-
ing a N.E. gale.

Lat $37^{\circ} 45'$ Long $69^{\circ} 30'$

Saturday 10th Comes with strong N.E. gale the
Bark laying too, the latter same.

Lat $36^{\circ} 50'$ Long $68^{\circ} 40'$

Sunday 11th Strong N.E. heading S. Easterly the
latter ditto down nothing.

Lat $36^{\circ} 04'$ Long $67^{\circ} 30'$

Monday 12. Comes with wind from the E. South
erly heading S. by East, the latter the
schooner implevied getting boats &c

Lat $35^{\circ} 11'$ Long $66^{\circ} 50'$
