Tuesday 30th At Sun set lowered for a Sp.
W. struck him and killed
him, lost the W Boat stove,
by him after dark lost the Whale
Lat 9. A.M. of the 31. found the
Whale got him to the Ship and
went to work on him, on
the 3rd of September finished boiling
the Whale struck by L.B.

Sunday 4th Lat 18-24. Long = 93-15

September 5th

Monday. Fine & rough, with slatter mo-
derate all hands employed stow-
ing down air.

Tuesday 6th Begins with moderate trade
heading to S.E. at 6 p.m. was
Ship to N.E. middle slatter dite
employed stowing down cooping
W.

Wednesday 7th Rugged & finishing stowing down
& clearing up. & middle slatter dit.

Thursday 8th Lat.

All hands employed clearing
up. & middle slatter dite im-
posed washing Ship. I was very af-
fected with a bile in my wrist for

Friday 9th Rough sea & strong trade
all hands washing their clothes
middle slatter dite + 93-27
Lat 18-25. Long 93-27

Saturday 10th Begins with rough weather and
strong squally heading S. with-
ing the time may come to start
for home. Home sent Home. the
latter dite W.

Lat 18-08. Long =
