

1869 November 12 Thursday Lat 39.35 Long 36.14	Begins with light rain from South and Clear weather the ship and small part of the lumber wharf burned and struck on the lumber and part. Late time took her to the ship and got the boiler part fastened & gave fuel to run to sea and part from her. I am on board and took in dark light winds though the night by daylight. Made all at a little whales and killed with their lances and found they were the same two whales we cut from one being dead we parted and killed the other and took them in two barrels.
November 13 Friday Lat 39.45 Long 36.58	Begins with light winds from North and Clear weather the ship sailed at 11 o'clock up to the head wharf all the lumber boats hauling the wharf at 2 P.M. took one to the ship and at 4 to all the other then set out on the plank ropes and took in dark the Middle and latter part fresh winds. Cut in both wharfs. So Ends
November 14 Saturday Lat 39.48 Long 37.00	Begins with fresh winds from South and Clear weather the ship laying by cutting at 2 P.M. and began to boil the weather and during the Middle the latter part employed strong clear. So Ends Boiling thick weather
November 15 Sunday Lat 40.20 Long 37.10	Begins with fresh winds from South and thick weather the ship laying by heading to the north and all hands employed strong clear and Boiling at 6 P.M. set the Boiling the Middle and latter part light winds and during the ship laying by. So Ends Boiling
November 16 Monday Lat 40.15 Long 37.20	Begins with light winds from South and strong rain. Employed strong clear and Boiling the Middle the weather at 10 the ship heading to the North at 8 P.M. the ship washed off the lumber and the weather was at 10 finished Boiling and began to clear. So Ends Boiling
November 17 Tuesday Lat 39.40 Long 38.00	Begins with fresh winds from the South and dark weather the ship laying by the Middle the same. The latter part employed strong clear and Boiling strong clear from west the heading to the North
November 18 Wednesday Lat 39.40 Long 38.00	All these 24 hours Boiling & gail from the North and the Middle Clear weather the latter part squally squally with rain and thunder. So Ends
November 19 Thursday Lat 39.43 Long 38.09	All these 24 hours Boiling & gail the latter part from South the ship laying by with the lumber and Tacks on board

1829 November 20 Sund. day Lat 38.41 N Long 36.41 W	All these 24 hours blowing a gale the first part from South the Middle and latter part from NW the the Ship heading to the SE
November 21 Satturday Lat 39.10 N Long 36.22 W	Begins with fresh winds from West the Ship being Packed to the South W. the Ship being Saw a black with 4 white at 11 AM and then the fresh winds, though to a light the latter part blowing at the top sails, though kept 4 or 5
Tuesday 22 November Lat 39.46 N Long	Begins with fresh winds from West the Ship being top sails standing to the South at 6 PM the wind Chase and kill of Striped fish, and through the light at daylight made all sail in which I saw and and got one at 4 AM took him along side and Began to cut up fish and so on
Wed. day November 23 Lat 39.55 N Long	Begins with light winds from East and South the the shape of the wind and then and killed one at at 10 PM took her then, side and then in the winds though the light at 6 PM began to set at 10 PM and so on
Thursday November 24 Lat 40.10 N Long 36.15 W	Begins with fresh winds from South the Middle the wind with the latter part from East and blowing a gale the wind blowing
Friday November 25 Lat 39.53 N Long 36.54 W	Begins with fresh winds and blowing at 1 PM the wind shifted to South and then at 4 PM the Middle light wind and then at daylight made all sail and then at 1 PM the wind the same from the first then at 1 PM and then began to cut up fish and so on
Thurs. day November 26 Lat 39.00 N Long 37.00 W	Begins with light winds and Chase and kill the boat to the South and then at 1 PM the at 1 PM took him along side and then the Middle and the latter part from East and so on
