Monday the August 21st 1854

Commences with fine breezes from the N.E. W. Steering East Saw a Sail. Middle and latter part light airs and calms. course East Saw four Sails crew implor'd in various jobs. and so ends Charles A Carpenter off Duty Lat. at Noon 38.33 N Theodore J Haskell off Duty Long at 22 part 3.33. 33 W

Tuesday the 22nd

Commences with calms and light airs from various points Course E. crew implor'd in sundry jobs crew implor'd Saw 3 Sails. Middle part calm. latter part light airs from the Westward Steering East Saw three Sails Saw grampuses. crew implor'd in sundry jobs and so ends there 24 hours Charles A Carpenter off Duty

Wednesday the 23rd

Commences with light airs from the westward Saw 2 Sails one a Whaler broke out water crew implor'd in sundry jobs Middle part light airs from the westward Steering E. by N. latter part light airs variable from the West and S. W. Saw the Island of Flores at about 20 miles Dist Steering in for the land Saw four Sails crew implor'd in sundry jobs and so ends Charles A Carpenter off Duty

Thursday the 24th

Commences with light airs from the S. W. S. E. by E. at 4 P. M. Saw a Ship with her main yard aback and a Lark to the windward of her running down to her tacked Ship and stood up for them and gave with Ship two Brothers of N. B. and the Bark Legrange of fair haven the Bark 5 months out with 1000 lbs Sperm and Ship Sixty days with 600 lbs Sperm. Middle part fresh breezes from the South latter part much the same laying off and on at Flores in company with the bark Legrange at 4th part 7 A M Capt Fisher and Capt Thomas went on Shore in a portage it being to suggest to land in a whale boat and so ends

Wednesday

Friday August the 25th 1854

Commences with strong breezes from the South laying off and on at Flores the Capt on Shore to get recruits at 4th before 4 P. M. Sent the Second mate on Shore after the Captain he having strict orders from Capt Fisher not to land as it was not fit for a whale boat to land Mr Weeks went in and attempted to land Mr Weeks got out and Thore'd the boat off and the caprised in the Surf and two men was Drowned. George W Smith a boatster and John Cox Seaman. at 12 past 6 P. M. Capt Thomas came on board bringing Capt Fisher and the

remaining part of the boats crew in his boat Middle part fresh breezes from the South Steer'd of Shore to the Westward at 12 o'clock wore Ship and stood in Shore at 12 past 7 A M the Capt went on Shore the Potagers had picked up the two men that was Drowned the Capt went Shore with boards and made coffins and had them buried as decent as possible. received on board 15 barrels of Potatoes and 2 bls of onions and 60 Pumpkins and so ends Charles A Carpenter and Theodore J Haskell off Duty

Saturday the 26th

Commences with fresh breezes from the South Laying off and on at Flores the Capt on Shore. at 6 A M the Capt came on board in Capt Thomas boat Middle and latter part fresh breezes from the South and S. W. Standing off and on the the and so ends there 24 hours

Commences with fine breezes from the South and S. W. laying off and to Flores Capt Fisher did not go on Shore it being so suggest Saw four Sails to the Westward Middle and latter part light breezes from S. W. at 4th part 8 A M the Capt went on Shore to finish getting off recruits and so ends there 24 hours Charles A Carpenter off Duty Theodore J Haskell off Duty
