

Remarks On Board Ship Stephania New

Friday Sept the 22th 1854

Commences with light breezes from the E. S. E. Steering by the wind to the South saw five Sails crew imploried in sundry jobs Middle part light airs from the Eastward Steering by the wind to the South latter part much the same crew imploried in sundry jobs at 10 A.M. raised blackfish lowered the boats and took one to the Starboard boat and so ends these 24 hours Lat 11.43. N Long 24.53 W

Saturday Sept the 23th

Commences with light airs and calms from the Eastward Steering to the Southward saw several Sails spoke with an English bark bound to England Middle part calm latter part light airs from the S. W. commenced boiling the blackfish and so ends these 24 hours Lat 11.26. North Long 24.50 West

Sunday the 24th Commences with light winds from the East Steering S. by E. finished boiling the blackfish at 6 A.M. spoke the Bark Cape Horn Pigeon and Capt. May came on board. Middle and latter part fine breezes from the East Steering S. by E. at noon spoke the Cape Horn Pigeon and Capt. Fisher went on board and so ends Lat 09.52 N Long 23.46 W

Monday the 25th

Commences with fine breezes from the Eastward Steering S. by E. at half past 7 P.M. Capt. Fisher came on board Middle part fine breezes from the East Steering South by E. with some rain latter part calm the Capt. of the Spartan of Nantucket came on board after letters the Mary Wilder and Cape Horn Pigeon in sight and so ends these 24 hours Lat at noon 08.59 N Long at 2 22.51 W

Bedford Bound towards the South Atlantic

Tuesday Sept the 26th 1854

Commences with light airs and calms steering S. by E. saw several Sails crew imploried in sundry jobs Middle part Middle part light baffling winds and squally latter part light breezes from the Eastward Steering South. saw several Sails Lat at Noon 07.37 N and so ends these 24 hours Long at 2 - 22.33 W

Wednesday the 27th

Commences with verable winds and squally steering to the Southward crew imploried in sundry jobs Middle part verable winds from the S. W. Steering by the wind to the Southward and Eastward and rainy, latter part much the same crew imploried in sundry jobs and so ends these 24 hours Lat 07.06 N Long 21.29. W

Thursday the 28th

Commences with light verables winds from the S. W. Steering by the wind to S. E. saw three Sails Middle part light breezes from the Southward and Westward Steering by the wind to the Southward. latter part calm crew imploried in breaking out Water and Butter and meat. and so ends these 24 hours Lat 06.40 North Long 20.56 West

Friday the 29th

Commences with calm weather saw three Sails exchanged Signals with an english Steam Frigate crew imploried in sundry jobs. Middle part light verable winds and calms Steering S. S. W. latter part light verable winds from the S. W. with some rain lowered the boats for blackfish but got nothing and so ends Lat 05.53 N Long 20.40 W

Saturday the 30th

Commences with light airs and calms from the S. W. Steering by the wind to the Southward and Eastward with some rain saw blackfish Middle and latter part strong breezes from South Steering by the wind to the W. S. W. and squally with some rain. saw five Sails. crew imploried in picking over potatoes and so ends. Lat. 05.04 North Long-
