

Remarks On board Ship Stephania
February Wednesday the 14th 1855

Commences with Strong breezes from the S. S. W
Received on board 38 Pumpkins and 2 cords
of wood Latter part fine weather received on board
52 bags of Potatoes and 11 bags of onions and so ends

Thursday the 15th

Commences with pleasant weather Sent 2 casks
of corn on Shore crew employed in picking
over potatoes and onions Latter part fine weather
the Starboard Watch men on shore on 24 hours liberty
the crew employed in Sundry jobs and so ends

Friday the 16th

Commences with fine weather crew employed
in getting ready to smoke ship Latter part
crew employed in Sundry jobs and so ends the Harbor
went on Shore on Liberty

Saturday the 17th

Commences with fine breezes and pleasant weather
at 4 P.M. shut the Ship up and Smoked her
Latter part pleasant weather at 6 A.M. took of
the hatches and found a great number of Dead
rats the Steward Brother Parkin Robert Scott
and Charles A Carpenter Discovered Sent officers
in pursuit and so ends this Day

Sunday the 18th

Commences with Strong breezes from the S. S. W
the Ship all ready for sea. waiting for Diverses
at 6 P.M. the Capt came on board had Sold 300
lbs of oil Silvia Boutsteerer Sampson Ship
keeper and the Cooper was taken out of jail
fine 10 Shillings each and so ends this Day

Monday the 19th

Commences with Strong winds from the S. S. W
and pleasant Latter part fine weather commenced
breaking out oil and so ends this Day

Laying to Anchor In Swan River
Tuesday the 20th

Commences with fine weather at 1 P.M. hauled
the Brig Emma of Sydney along Side and Delivered
3664 gallons of Oil imperial measure crew employed
in breaking out oil and Stowing away Water
Latter part fine weather crew employed in Stowing
Down and Stowing of Stowen Decks and so ends this Day

Wednesday the 21st

Commences with fine weather at 1 P.M. hauled the
Brig Emma along Side and Discharged 10 casks of
oil containing 1469 gallons of oil imperial measure
at 6 P.M. the Brig hauled away from along Side

Latter part fine weather at 7 A.M. hauled the
Brig Emma along Side and Discharged 12 casks of
oil containing 2127 gallons. finished Stowing
the Brig Discharged in all 30 tons of oil
and so ends this Day

Thursday the 22nd

Commences with fine weather at 10 past 1
P.M. the hauled away from along Side. crew
employed in clearing up Decks and getting ready
for Sea Latter part fine weather broke out water
Sent 2 casks on Shore and filled them and took them on
Board Stowed the Starboard Anchor the Capt on
Shore getting Ready for Sea and so ends this Day

Friday the 23rd

Commences with fine weather the Ship all ready
for sea waiting for men and for the Settlement
of the Ship's bill on Shore at 5 P.M. the men came
on board Henry Spicer Steward William Smith and
William Woods John ^{Seagren} ~~Homes~~ Latter part fine weather
at 10 past 6 the Harbor Master came on board and
the Police to search the Ship at 8 A.M. took over
anchor and stood to Sea under all sail and so
ends these 24 hours
