after noon saw nothing more at sun set took in
sail Latter part strong breezes from the South Steering
by the wind to the Westward at 9 A. M. tacked Ship
and stood to the N. E. and so ends Lat. 27. 18 S
Long 108. 04 E

Saturday the 3rd
Commences with fine breezes from the South
Steering to the N. E. Saw 4 Sails at 6 P. M. Spoke
the Twilight Capt Tompkins and the Capt Wing
Capt Meeks. Capt Fisher went on board of the
Twilight. at 4 past 9 Capt Fisher came on board. Spoke the
bark Adventure of London 23 months out with 550 bl. Sperm
Latter part strong breezes from the South Steering by
the wind to the Eastward at noon spoke the bark Flying
H. Grapo of Dartmouth with 50 bl. of Sperm wore Ship
and stood by the wind to the westward Saw 5 Sails.

stood by the wind to the S. S. W. and so ends this Day
