Thursday April the 5th 1855

Commence with Strong breezes from the South
Steered by the wind to the Eastward saw one Sail
Latter part Strong breezes from the S. E. Steered by
the wind to the westward Saw two Sails
and so ends these 24 hours Lat 27. 12 S
Long 108. 33 E

Friday the 6th

Commence with strong breezes from the S. E.
Steered by the wind to the Eastward Latter part
fresh gale from the S. E. Steered by the wind to the
S. E. W. and so ends these 24 hours Lat 27. 03 S
Long 108. 49 E

Saturday the 7th

Commence with fresh gales from the S. E. Steered
by the wind to the S. E. W. Latter part Strong
breezes from the S. E. Steered by the wind to the Eastward
and so end these 24 hours Lat 27. 26 S
Long 108. 36 E

Sunday the 8th

Commence with Strong breezes from the S. E.
Steered by the wind to the Eastward Saw one Sail
Latter part fresh breezes from the S. E. Steered N. W. by W.
Saw one sail and so ends these 24 hours Lat 26. 38 S
Long 108. 27 E

Monday the 9th

Commence with Strong breezes from the S. E. Steered
by the wind to the S. W. at 9 P. M. spoke the Ship
Lap Wing Capt Weeks Capt Fisher went on Board
at 9 P. M. returned on board were Ship and
steered to the Eastward. Latter part fine breezes from
the S. E. Steered by the wind to the Eastward Saw two
Sails and so ends these 24 hours Lat 26. 51 S
Long 108. 34 E

Tuesday the 10th

Commence with fine breezes from the S. E. Steered
by the wind to the Eastward at 2 P. M. tacked Ship
and steered by the wind to the Westward saw 4 Sails
Latter part fine breezes from the S. E. Steered by the
wind to the Westward Saw two Sails and so ends
this Day Lat 26. 56 S
Long 108. 40 E

Commence with fine breezes from the S. E.
Steered by the wind to the Eastward at 20 minutes
before 4 rose Sperm whale at 1 P. M. lowered the
boats in pursuit at 5 the mat boat struck took
the whale at 6 took the whale along side took
in sail and set watch. Latter part fine breezes from
the South and cloudy weather at 6 P. M. commenced
cutting the whale at 4 before 10 finished and so ends
this Day No Observation

Thursday the 12th

Commence with fine breezes from the South Steered
on Different tacks at 5 P. M. spoke the Ship Hunter
Capt Munroe Capt Fisher went on board crew
implored in clearing up Decks. saw 4 Sails Latter
calm and light airs from the Westward boiling the Whale
Saw Nothing and so ends these 24 hours Lat 26. 51 S
Long 108. 12 E

Friday the 13th

Commence with calm weather boiling the Whale saw
Nothing Latter part fine breezes from the S. E. Steered by
the wind to the Eastward boiling Saw 4 Sails and so ends
Lat 26. 42 S
Long 108. 32 E

Saturday the 14th

Commence with fine breezes from the S. E. Steered by
the wind to the wind to the Southward and Westward
Saw 4 Sails finished boiling at Sunset Took in
sail and wore Ship Latter part fine breezes from the
S. E. at 7 P. M. wore Ship and steered by the wind to
the S. W. Saw one sail and so ends Lat
Long

Sunday the 15th

Commence with fine breezes from the S. E. Steered
by the wind to the S. W. at Sun Set took in sail and
wore Ship Latter part fresh breezes from the S. E. Steered by
the wind to the S. E. Saw one sail and so ends
