Tuesday May the 8th 1855

Commences with fine breezes from the East steering to the North. Saw two Sails at sunset took in sail and wore ship crew employed repairing the main topsail. Latter part fresh breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. Saw two Sails Lat. 23. 42 S Long 108. 44 E

Wednesday the 9th

Commences with fresh breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. S. W. at 4 P. M. Spoke the Ship Twilight of New Bedford had got Nothing this Season Latter part Strong breezes from S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. the Twilight in sight Lat 23. 50 S and so ends these 24 hours Long 108. 24 E

Thursday the 10th

Commences with Strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the E. N. E. at 6 P. M. Spoke the Barks Massasoit and the Adventure of London Latter part Strong breezes from the S. E. Steered by the wind to the S. S. W. Saw one Sail Lat. 23. 15 S and so ends these 24 hours

Friday the 11th

Commences with Strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. S. W. Saw one Sail Latter part fine breezes from the the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. at 9 A. M. wore Ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. Lat 23. 48 S and so ends, Saw two Sails Long 108. 31 E

Saturday the 12th

Commences with fine breezes from the S. E. Steered by the wind on Diferant tacks at 5 P. M. Spoke the Bark. Latter part light breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. Lat 23. 30 S and so ends these 24 hours Long 108. 31 E Long by Loner. 106. 06 E

Sunday May the 13th 1855

Commences with light breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. Saw one Sail at sun set wore Ship and stood to the S. W. Latter part light breezes from the S. S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. Saw fin backs. and so ends these 24 hours Lat. 23. 47 S Long 108. 47 E

Monday the 14th

Commences with fine breezes from the S. S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. Latter part fine breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. S. W. Saw 6 Sails and so ends these 24 hours Lat. 24. 40 S Long 107. 35 E

Tuesday the 15th

Commences with fine breezes from the S. E. steering by the to the S. S. W. three Sails in sight at 3 P. M. Tacked Ship and stood by the wind to the E. N. E. at 5 P. M. Spoke the Bark Lexington of N Bedford Capt Smith 5 months out with 20 bbls of sperm Latter part fine breezes from the S. E. steering on Diferent courses from N. to W. Saw two Sails Lat. 24. 49 S and so ends these 24 hours Long 107. 12 E

Wednesday the 16th

Commences with fine breezes from the S. E. steering to the S. W. at 1 P. M. Spoke the Ship the Ellen Augusta of New Port 5 Month but no oil Latter part fine breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. at 1 A. M. tacked Ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. and so ends these 24 hours Lat 24. 43 Long 107. 20

Thursday the 17th

Commences with fine breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the E. N. E. Saw 4 Sails. Latter part fine breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. saw 6 Sails and so ends these 24 hours Lat 24. 22 S Long 107. 25 E
