

Remarks On Board Ship Stephania

Friday June the 8th 1855

Commences with light breezes from the S. E. at 1 P.M. the waste boat went out to the whale the settled and hove head up to the boat and got slight fast but soon Drawed chased the whale till night but could not get past Latter part strong breezes from the S. E. Steering to the Southward and westward. Saw Nothing and so ends. Lat 22° 52' S Carpenter off Duty Long 108° 10' E

Saturday the 9th

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. Steering by the wind to the S. W. at 4 P.M. tacked ship and stood by the wind to the Eastward. Latter part fresh

breezes from the E. S. E. Steering by the wind on difront tacks saw one sail and so ends Lat 22° 36' S Carpenter off Duty Long 109° 18' E

Sunday the 10th

Commences with fresh breezes from the E. S. E. Steering by the wind to the South. Latter part strong breezes from the E. S. E. Steering by the wind to the South Lat 23° 38' S Saw 3 Sails and so ends these 24 hours Long 108° 56' E

Monday the 11th

Commences with strong breezes from the E. S. E. Steering by the wind to the South at 4 P.M. spoke the W. H. Crane of Dartmouth nothing this season. at 6 P.M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. Latter

part strong breezes from the E. S. E. Steering by the wind to the N. E. at 8 A.M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the South saw 3 Sails and so ends Lat 23° 27' S Carpenter off Duty Long 109° 00' E

Tuesday the 12th

Commences with strong breezes from the E. S. E. Steering by the wind to the South saw 3 Sails at 6 P.M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. Latter part strong breezes from the E. S. E. at 7 A.M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the South saw two sails Lat 23° 24' S and so ends these 24 hours Long 109° 05' E Carpenter came on Duty

Cruising off the West Coast New Holland

Wednesday June the 13th 1855

Commences with fresh breezes from the E. S. E. steering by the wind to the south saw two sails at 6 P.M. spoke the Congress Capt Kelley of New Bedford. Latter part light breezes from the E. S. E. Steered to the Westward saw two sails Lat 24° 05' S and so ends these 24 hours Long 108° 36' E

Thursday the 14th

Commences with light breezes from the N. E. Steered by the wind to the N. W. at 6 P.M. tacked ship and stood by the wind to S. E. Latter part light breezes from the N. E. steering by the wind on Difrent tacks Lat 23° 35' S and so ends these 24 hours Long 109° 15' E

Friday the 15th

Commences with light breezes from the North steering on Difrent coarses saw 3 Sails. Latter part light breezes from the N. E. Steered W. by S. saw 3 Sails Lat 23° 45' S and so ends these 24 hours Long 108° 39' E

Saturday the 16th

Commences with light breezes from the N. E. steered to the Westward at 4 P.M. spoke the ship Congress of New Bedford. Latter part fresh gales from the N. E. with some rain. Saw two sails and so ends Lat 24° 02' S Long 108° 43' E

Sunday the 17th

Commences with fresh gales from the N. E. E. laying by the wind heading East saw one sail. Latter part fresh gale from the Westward and rainy weather saw two sails and so ends these 24 hours

Monday the 18th

Commences with strong breezes from the Westward with some rain saw one sail. Latter part light airs from the Westward saw two sails. fin Backs and Black fish and so ends these 24 hours Lat 23° 43' S Long 109° 17' E
