

Remarks On Board Ship Stephaniea

Friday Oct. the 26th 1852

Commences with fine breezes from the East Steering N.W. by W. Saw fin backs. Middle part rainy and thick weather Latter part fresh breezes from the East with cloudy weather at 8 A.M. Steered N.W. by S. Lat. at noon 34.20 S and so ends these 24 hours Long at 2 P.M. 60.01 E

Saturday the 27th

Commences with strong breezes from the East Steering by the wind to the S.W. by S. at sundown Double reefed the top sails Middle and Latter part fine breezes from the N.E. Steering on Diferant courses from South to West at 10 A.M. Lowered the boats

for right whales struck killed and sunk one

and so ends these 24 hours

Sunday the 28th

Commences with fine breezes from the S.E. the boats chasing right whales at 2 P.M. the waste boat struck the Starboard boat struck the lone whale killed them and took them along side at 6 P.M. commenced cutting at 11 past 9 finished cutting one whale took in sail and set the watch Middle part fine breezes from the North Latter part much the same at 6 A.M. commenced cutting at 10 finished cleared the Decks and commenced boiling and so ends these 24 hours

Sunday the 29th

Commences with fine breezes from the North Steering by the wind to the Eastward at 4 P.M. wore ship and stood by the wind to Westward. imploied in boiling. Middle part rainy the wind hauled to the S.W. laying by the wind heading S.E. by S. Latter part Strong breezes from the S.W. with rain. at 11 past 5 Steered North at 9 laped to wind heading N.W. by W. reefed the main top sail. and furled the fore sail. all hands imploied in setting up shoeks and boiling and so ends these 24 hours

Cruising for right whales

Tuesday the 30th 1855

Commences with strong breezes from the S.W. laying by the wind heading N.W. by W. saw one sail. imploied in setting up shoeks and boiling Middle part much the same Latter part fine breezes from the West Steering by the wind to the Northward boiling and so ends this Day. Lat 35.26 S

Long 59.26 E

Wednesday the 31st

Commences with strong breezes from the Steering by the wind to the southward at 11 past 4 saw right whales lowered two boats without success. Middle part Middle and Latter part light airs and calms the wind to the south backing and setting up shoeks Lat at noon 35.19 S

and so ends these 24 hours Long at 2 59.27 E

Thurs day the 1st

Commences with calm weather boiling at 3 P.M. saw a whale turn flicks supposed it to be a right 5 miles off Middle part fine breezes from the North Steered to the S.W. till 12 o'clock then laped to the wind heading N.W. by W. at 7 A.M. commenced stowing down oil. at 9 A.M. finished boiling and so ends this Day

No observation

Friday the 2nd

Commences with strong breezes from the N.W. and squally Steering by the wind to the N.W. all hands imploied in stowing down oil. Middle and Latter part

much the same at 7 P.M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the N.W. E. imploied in stowing down oil

and so ends these 24 hours Lat 35.40 S

Long 59.12 E

Saturday the 3rd

Commences with strong breezes from the N.W. Steering by the wind to the N.W. E. at 2 P.M. finished stowing down the oil. at 2 Saw right whales lowered without success. Middle and Latter part light breezes from the N.W. at 2 A.M. wore S. Ship and stood by the wind to the S.W. frequent showers of rain and so ends these 24 hours
