Tuesday Nov. the 13<sup>th</sup> 1855

Commences with strong breezes from the North steering by the wind to the Eastward. at 4 P.M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the westward saw fin backs. Middle part baffling winds from North to South with rain. Latter part fine breezes from the S. S. W. steering by the wind to the West. at a past 10 A.M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the S. E. saw fin backs and so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday the 14<sup>th</sup>

Commences with fine breezes from the S. W. steering to the S. E. at 3 P.M. saw two right whales lowered the boats in pursuit. chased til sun set without success. Middle part fresh breezes from the West laying by the wind heading S. S. W. at 2 A.M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the Northward. Latter part strong breezes from the N. W. at 6 A.M. steered S. E. Lat. 36. 10 S and so ends these 24 hours

Thursday the 15<sup>th</sup>

Commences with strong breezes from the S. W. steering E. S. E. saw fin backs Middle part strong breezes from the N. S. W. at 8 P.M. luffed to the wind heading N. W. Latter part fresh gales from the West. at a past 4 A.M. set Double reefed top sails and steered S. E. by E. Lat 36. 16 S and so ends these 24 hours

Friday the 16<sup>th</sup>

Commences with fresh gales from the West steering S. E. by E. saw fin backs at 6 P.M. luffed by the wind to the Northward with close reefed main top sail main spencers and fore topmast stay sail set. Middle and Latter part strong gales from the West at 6 A.M. wore ship to the South at 3 A.M. steered S. E. Lat. 36. 19 S and so ends these 24 hours

Saturday the 17<sup>th</sup>

Commences with strong gals from the N. S. W. at 1 P.M. luffed by the wind to the South. Middle and Latter part fresh gals from the S. W. at 7 A.M. steered E. S. E. Lat. 36. 23 S with close reefed top sails and so ends these 24 hours

Commences with strong breezes from the S. W. steering E. S. E. at 4 P.M. steered East under Double reefed top sails Middle and Latter part fine breezes from the West with a heavy S. W. swell. steering East Lat. 35. 51 S and so ends these 24 hours

Monday the 19<sup>th</sup>

Commences with fine breezes from the west with a heavy S. W. swell. steering E. by S. saw fin backs Middle and Latter part fine breezes from the N. N. W. steering E. by S. at 7 A.M. sent down the fore sail to Repair Lat. 35. 26. S and so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday the 20<sup>th</sup>

Commences with fin breezes from the N. W. steering E. by N. at 2 P.M. saw a right Whale lowered the boats the waste boat went on but did not fasten came on board. at 4 P.M. lowered for two whales to the windward chased til sunset without success. Middle part fine breezes from the N. W. steering by the wind N. N. E. at 2 A.M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the S. W. Latter part fine breezes from the North steering to the on Diferant courses from N. E. to S. E. saw fin backs and so ends these 24 hours
