

Remarks On Board Ship Stephania

Monday April the 21th 1856

Commences with fresh gales from the East steering N. N. W. at 4 P. M. steered N. by E. at sun set took in the fore sail and layed by the main heading N. N. E. Middle part fresh gales from the E. N. E. Latter part more morder ~~set~~ set Double reefed topsails and stood by the wind to the North and so ends Lat 24. 47 S Long 107. 31 E

Tuesday the 22th

Commences with strong breezes from the E. N. E. steering by the wind to the North set the jib and main sail at sun set took in sail Middle and Latter part the same saw one fin back and so ends Lat 23. 1. S Long 107. 15 E

Wednesday the 23th

Commences with strong breezes from the E. N. E. steering by the wind to the S. E. Middle and Latter part the same. and so ends these 24 hours Lat 24. 26. S Long 107. 51 E

Thursday the 24th

Commences with light breezes from the N. E. steering by the wind to the E. S. E. Middle part much the same Latter part the same at 8th tacked ship and stood by the wind to the N. W. put out the main boat on the starboard cranes set main stays saw a hump Back and two or three sulphur bottoms Lat 25. 05 S and so ends these 24 hours 107. 61 E

Friday the 25th

Commences with light breezes from the E. S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. imployed in sundry sundy jobs Middle and latter part light breezes from the East steering by the wind to the North and so ends Lat 24. 23. S Long 107. 41 E

Saturday the 26th

Commences with light breezes from the East steering by the wind to the South. saw fin Backs. Middle and Latter part light breezes from the East steering by the wind to the North imployed in fitting the bob stays Lat 24. 04. S and so ends these 24 hours Long 107. 19 E

Cruising off the West Coast New Holland

April Sunday the 27th 1856

Commences with light breezes from the E. S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. Middle and Latter part much the same at 6 A. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to S. S. W. at 11 A. M. tacked ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. and so ends this Day Lat 23. 57 S Long 107. 25 E

Monday the 28th

Commences with fine breezes from the E. S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. saw a Big standing by the wind to the southward. Middle and Latter part much same saw nothing imployed in painting Larboards and over head boats and so ends these 24 hours Lat 23. 21. S Long 108. 51 E

Tuesday the 29th

Commences with fine breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the E. N. E. saw Nothing. Middle and Latter part the same. at 6 A. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the S. S. W. saw a fin Back Lat 23. 40 S Long

Wednesday the 30th

Commences with fresh breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. S. W. at 8 past 3 P. M. tacked stood by the wind to the E. N. E. saw sulphur bottoms Middle and Latter part the same at 8 past 1 A. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the S. S. W. and so ends Lat 23. 38 S Long 108. 29 E

May Thursday the 1st

Commences with fine breeze from the S. E. tacked ship and stood by the wind to the E. N. E. Middle and Latter part the same. at 7 A. M. tacked ship to the S. W. imployed in picking over onions Lat 23. 15 S and so ends these 24 hours Long 108. 20 E

Friday the 2nd

Commences with fresh breezes from the S. S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. Middle and Latter part strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. S. W. saw Sulphur bottoms and so ends these 24 hours Lat 24. 30 S Long 107. 18 E
