

Remarks On Board Ship Stephania

Tuesday June the 3rd 1856

Commences with light airs and variable winds with a heavy swell from the S.W. Lutting at 5 P.M. finished. bark in sight to the westward Middle variable wind and rainey at 1 A.M. commenced boiling. Latter part light variable winds and calms boiling the Bark ~~at~~ Haughton in sight Lat 23. 58 S and so ends these 24 hours Long 117. 24 E

Wednesday the 4th

Commences with light winds from the S.E. steering by the wind to the S.W. boiling Middle and Latter part light breezes from the South stood by the wind

to the westward imploied in setting up shooks and boiling and so ends these 24 hours Latter part

Lat 23. 45 S
Long 105. 49 E

Thursday the 5th

Commences with light breezes from the South steering by the wind to the westward imploied in boiling at 6 P.M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the Eastward Middle and Latter part light breezes from the S.E.

at 6 A.M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the S.E. bark in sight to the windward Lat 23. 43 S and so ends these 24 hours Long

Friday the 6th

Commences with light breezes from the S.E. steering by the wind to the S.S.W. imploied in boiling at 6 P.M. finished boiling. Middle and Latter part much the same imploied in stowing down oil and shifting water from the lower hold into the between decks and so ends these 24 hours

Long 106. 34 E

Saturday the 7th

Commences with strong breezes from the S.E. steering by the wind to the S.S.W. imploied in stowing down oil. Middle part fresh breezes from the S.E. steering by the wind to the N.E. Latter part the same imploied in stowing down oil and so ends this Day Lat 24. 16 S Long 106. 30 E

Cruising Off the West Coast New Holland

Sunday June the 8th 1856

Commences with fine breezes from the S.E. steering by the wind to the S.E. finished stowing down and washed off the ship Middle part strong breezes from the S.E. steering by the wind to the S.E. Latter part the same at 6 A.M. saw sperm whales. Lowered the boats the waste boat struck and got one chased the shore till 12 o'clock came on board the bark Henry H. Crape and Jonia in sight the Henry H. Crape got a whale and so ends these 24 hours Lat

Long

Monday the 9th

Commences with strong breezes from the S.E. at 4 pas 1 P.M. commenced cutting at dark had his head off and body in let his head lay along side all night

at 4 past 6 A.M. hooked on to the head at 12 finished and commenced boiling and so ends this Day Lat 23. 43

Long 106. 01

Tuesday the 10th

Commences with strong breezes from the S.E. made sail and stood by the wind to the S.E. passed Bark Henry H. Crape boiling Middle the same. Latter part fine breezes from the East wore ship and stood by the wind to the South boiling and so ends these 24 hours Lat 23. 44 S

Long 106. 15 E

Wednesday the 11th

Commences with fine breezes from the East steering

by the wind to the south boiling Middle part and Latter part fresh breezes from the East steering by the

wind to the S.S.E. saw a sail Lat 24. 39 S and so ends these 24 hours Long 106. 16 E

Thursday the 12th

Commences with strong breezes from the E. steering by the wind to the S.S.E. boiling at 8 P.M. finished boiling Middle part fresh breezes from the East to S.E. steering by the wind to the Southward and Eastward. Latter part light boiling wind and variable with some rain at 4 past 10 saw a sperm whale at 12 Lowered and so ends this Day
