

Remarks On Board Ship Stephania

Friday July the 18th 1856

Commences with fine breezes from the S. E. steering N. W. implored in rigging top mast studding sail booms, and bent the main royal. at 3 P. M. saw a spout of a whale astern luffed to the wind and made one tack to the windward it proved to be a hump back steered at N. W. again Middle and Latter part fresh breezes from the S. E. steering N. W. and N. W. by W. at 4th part 6 A. M. saw Cape Anjole bearing N. W. Dist 8 miles steered to the westward saw a merchant Bark Bound to the windward and so ends these 24 hours Lat. 6. 55 S Long 106. 00 E

Saturday the 19th

Commences with fresh breezes from the S. E. steering to the westward at 4 P. M. passed Travers Island at dark Helapper Island west point bearing North West 5 miles took in sail to Double reefed top sails. Middle part fresh breezes from the S. E. stood off shore until 2 A. M. tacked ship and stood in shore. at 7 A. M. off Garry head the hauled to the Northward made 2th tacks. at 11. calm. between pieces of Island and Garry head and so ends these 24 hours

Sunday the 20th

Commences with calm weather off Garry head 5 sails in sight at 4 P. M. had a light air from the south stood in for men Island at 7 P. M. came to anchor off the N. W. part of men Island in 27 fathoms of water in a thick rain squall Middle part moderate and rainy. Latter part light verable winds and rainy. at 6 A. M. took our anchor and stood farther up the bay and came to anchor again in 14 fathoms of water. and so ends this Day

Monday the 21st

Commences with light airs and calms Laying at anchor in New Bay Middle part roine. Latter part fine weather implored in washing ship and cutting wood and so ends these 24 hours

Laying at Anchor in New Bay

July Tuesday the 22th

Commences with ~~with~~ light airs and showery Laying at anchor in New Bay implored cutting wood and painting ship Middle part squally. Latter part light airs with some rain implored in cutting wood and getting of watter and so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday the 23th

Commences with calm weather implored in cutting wood and stowing away water Middle and Latter part fine weather implored in getting of wood and water and so ends these 24 hours

Thursday the 24th

Commences with fine weather all hands implored in getting off wood and water saw 9 sail of vessels bound up the straits Latter part Light airs from the N. E. at 6 A. M. took our anchor and started for Anjer and so ends this Day

Friday the 25th

Commences with calm weather at 7 P. M. came to anchor under 2th point Middle part. at 12 o'clock took our anchor with a light breezes from the East steered by the wind to the N. N. E. Latter part calm 7. sails in sight and so ends these 24 hours

Saturday the 26th

Commences with calm weather at 6 P. M. a light air from the East. by S. steering by the wind to the N. E. by N. 5th point bearing E. by S. west point of Princeps Island bearing N. 1/2 S hookaton bearing N 1/2 N. Middle part light airs from S. E. steering N. E. for Anjer at 6 A. M. off Anjer hill calm at 10 had a light breezes from the N. E. beating up for Anjer and so ends these 24 hours

Sunday the 27th

Commences with fine breezes from the North at 2 P. M. came to anchor in Anjer roads furled sails and commenced painting ship Middle part heavy thunder and lightning Latter part The Latter larboard with went on shore on Liberty and so ends these 24 hours

The Ship Sails 1 1/2 Strokes in 24 hours
