

Remarks On Board Ship Stephania

Saturday August the 9th 1856

Commences with fresh breezes from the S. E. steering N. by N. Middle part the same. Latter part fresh gales from the S. E. and squally steering S. W. by W. 1/2 W. and so ends these 24 hours Lat. 15. 26. S Long 30. 02. E

Sunday the 11th

Commences with fresh gales from the S. E. steering S. W. by W. 1/2 N. Middle and Latter part the same and so ends these 24 hours Lat. 16. 32. S Long 31. 40. E

Monday the 11th

Commences with fresh gales from the S. E. steering N. S. W. Middle and Latter the same set the main sail and turned the reef out of the main top sail and so ends these 24 hours Lat. 17. 38. S Long 34. 18. E

Tuesday the 12th

Commences with fresh breezes from the S. E. steering N. S. W. under single reefed top sails. Middle and Latter part strong breezes from the S. E. steering N. S. W. Lat. 18. 46. S Long 37. 53. E

Wednesday the 13th

Commences with fresh breezes from the S. E. steering W. by S. 1/2 S. Middle and Latter part the same Lat. 19. 37. S Long 40. 50. E

Thursday the 14th

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. steering N. by S. saw a sail ahead bound to the westward Middle and Latter part the same Lat. 20. 13. S Long 45. 40. E

Friday the 15th

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. steering S. by N. 1/2 N. by S. Middle and Latter part the same Lat. 21. 02. S Long 42. 16. E

The Ship Leaks 1400 Shakes in 24 hours

Bound towards the Isle of France

Saturday August the 16th August 1856

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. steering N. by N. Middle and Latter more moderate Lat. 21. 54. S and so ends these 24 hours Long 49. 40. E

Sunday the 17th

Commences with fine breezes from the S. E. steering N. by S. Middle part the same. Latter part steered N. by N. 1/2 N. and so ends these 24 hours Lat. 21. 45. S Long 67. 03. E

Monday the 18th

Commences with fine breezes from the S. E. steering N. by N. 1/2 N. at 1/2 past 3. P. M. saw the Isle of Bourbon bearing N. W. by W. 1/2 W. Dist 60 miles. at sun set took in sail to Double reefed top sail hauled up the courses. at 12 O. clock luffed to the wind heading to the southward at 3 P. M. steered off N. by N. Latter part implied in mending the fore top sail steering in for the land Lat. 21. 36. S and so ends these 24 hours Long 55. 21. E

Tuesday the 19th

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. steering down the south side of Bourbon at sun set took in sail and of shore on the southern tack the land bearing N. by E. Dist 8 miles. Middle and Latter part strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the southward implied in mending the fore main sail Lat. and so ends these 24 hours Long

Wednesday the 20th

Commences with fresh breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. finished and bent the main sail Middle and Latter part strong breezes from the S. E. at 1 P. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the South at 7 A. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. saw a bark to the windward Lat. and so ends these 24 hours Long
