

Remarks On Board Ship Stephania

Thursday August the 21th 1856

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. at 1 P. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the south. Bark in sight to the windward Middle and Latter part fresh breezes from the S. E. at 5 A. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. Bark in sight and so ends Lat. 21. 53 S Long

Friday the 22th

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. saw 2 sails at 6 P. M. spoke the bark Eugenia of New Bedford 11 months out with 251 of sperm Middle and Latter part the same at 1 P. M.

3 A. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. imploied in mending the main top sail and so ends these 24 hours Lat. 21. 31 S Long

Saturday the 23th

Commences with fresh breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. at 2 P. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to south at 5 P. M. finished and bent the main top sail 2 sails in sight Middle and Latter part moderate at 2 A. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. and so ends Lat. 21. 42 S

Sunday the 24th

Commences with light breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. at 5 P. M. tacked ship and stood by the wind off shore. Bourborn bearing North Dist 8 miles the Bark Eugenia in sight Middle and Latter part the same at 4 A. M. tacked ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. sail in sight Lat. 21. 34 S and so ends these 24 hours Long 55. 34 E

Monday the 25th

Commences with fine breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. saw 2 sails at 6 P. M. tacked ship and stood by the wind to the S. E. Middle and Latter part fresh breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the Southward at 6 A. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. saw one sail and so ends

Cruising Off the Isle of Bourborn

Tuesday the 26th

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. Bark Eugenia in sight. Exchanged signals with a French Bark at 5 P. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the S. S. W. Middle part squally and rainy close reefed the top sails. at 1 A. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. Latter part fresh breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. at 10 A. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the S. S. W. imploied in fitting the mizen riggin and so ends these 24 hours Lat. Long

Wednesday the 27th

Commences with fine breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. S. W. imploied in fitting the mizen riggin Middle and Latter part the same at 1 A. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. at 10 A. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the S. S. W. Lat. saw 2 sails. and so ends these 24 hours Long

Thursday the 28th

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. S. W. imploied in fitting the mizen riggin Middle and Latter part the same. at 1 A. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. and so ends Lat. 22. 26 S Long

Friday the 29th

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. at 6 P. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the S. S. W. Middle and Latter part fresh breezes from the S. E. at 1 P. M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the N. E. and so ends these 24 hours Lat. 21. 57 S

Saturday the 30th

Commences with fresh breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. at 6 P. M. spoke and gamed with the Eugenia Middle and Latter part fresh breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. and so ends these 24 hours
