

Remarks On Board Ship Stephania

August Sunday the 30th

Commences with fine breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind on Diferant tacks Bourbourn Bearing N. W. Dist. 20 miles Middle and Latter part fine breezes from the S. E. at 10 A. M. steered N. W. the Bark eugenia in sight and so ends these 24 hours Lat. 21. 38 S

September Monday the 1st

Commences with fine breezes from the S. E. steering N. W. at 5 P. M. luffed by the wind to the southward the land being North Dist. 10 miles. Middle and Latter part fresh breezes from the S. by E. at 2 A. M. wore Ship and stood by the wind to the Eastward saw 2 sails and so ends this Day.

Tuesday the 2nd

Commences with fresh breezes from the S. by E. steering N. N. W. Lowerd the boat and caught a small Black fish the Dist about 10 miles saw 2 Ship laying at anchor on the south side of the Island. Middle and Latter fresh gale from the S. S. E. at Dark Luffed by the wind to the S. W. under close reefed top sails at 7 A. M. steered Lat 21. 40 S west and so ends these 24 hours Long 53. 31 E

Wednesday the 3rd

Commences with fresh gales from the S. S. E. steering west under close reefed fore and mizen top sails and double reefed main at 6 P. M. took in the fore and mizen top sails and luffed by the wind to the S. W. Middle part the same. Latter part more morderate steering N. N. W. Lat. 22. 00 S and so ends these 24 hours Long 52. 16 E

Thursday the 4th

Commences with fresh breeze from the S. E. steering N. N. W. Middle and Latter part the same. middle part lugging by the wind on Diferant tacks. Latter part steered West and so ends these 24 hours Lat. 21. 53 S Long 51. 02 E.

Friday the 5th

Commences with fine breezes from the S. E. steering west at Dark Double reefed and luffed by the wind to the S. W. Latter part light breezes from the S. E. steering N. S. W. Lat 22. 16 S and so ends these 24 hours Long 50. 06 E

Cruising off Madagascar

Saturday September the 6th 1856

Commences with light breezes from the S. E. steering N. S. W. at sun set Double reefed the top sails and luffed to the wind to the southward. Latter part the same. at 7 A. M. steered N. S. W. and so ends these 24 hours Lat. 23. 09 S Long 49. 40 E

Sunday the 7th

Commences with light breezes from the S. E. steering S. W. at sun set Double reefed the top sails and stood by the wind to the South. Latter part fine breezes from the East steering by the wind to the southward at 7 A. M. saw 3 sperm whales 3 points off the weather bow going to the E. N. E. quick Lowerd the boats in pursuit chased till noon then came on board and so ends this Day.

Monday the 8th

Commences with fine breezes from the East beating to to the windward after the whales at 9 past 1 P. M. Lowerd 2 boats in pursuit the whales off the weather beam 3 1/2 miles off chased till night without success Middle and Latter part the same stood by the wind to the N. E. till 4 past 3 A. M. then tacked ship and stood by the wind to the southward saw nothing Lat. 23. 35 S and so ends these 24 hours Long 50. 04 E

Tuesday the 9th

Commences with fine breezes from the E. S. E. steering by the wind to the southward. Middle and Latter part the same. at 7 A. M. steered west saw 2 sails Lat. 23. 58 S and so ends these 24 hours Long 49. 46 E

Wednesday the 10th

Commences with light breezes from the East steering west at sun set Double reefed the top sails and luffed by the wind to the southward Middle and Latter part the same at 7 A. M. steered N. N. W. and so ends. Lat. 23. 56 S Long 49. 05 E

Thursday the 11th

Commences with fine breezes from the East steering N. S. W. saw 1. sail at Dark Double reefed the top sails and luffed by the wind to the south Middle and Latter part wind N. E. at 7 A. M. steered west and so ends. Lat. 24. 35 S Long 48. 41 E
