and set it. Ends fine and clear.

strong gales and rainy. At 2 A.M. double
reefed topsails. At 4 A.M. reefed mainmast
jib and more ship to S.E.
At 8 A.M. moderating some set jib and
whole mainmast. This day ends with
fresh gales, heavy sea, and cloudy
weather. Rove off new mainmast

Tuesday June 16th 1863

Moderate winds from S.S.W. Weather
clear and cool, passed several
squalls to the West. At 8 P.M.
heavy rain with lightning in the
western board. Fetched light sails
At 10 P.M. wind hauled to S.W. Middle
part drizzling rain. At 7 30 A.M.
wind hauled to N.W. in a squall
Weather looking bad reefed topsails
Last part more steady turned out
reefs & set 4th & 5th sails. Ends fresh
winds and drizzling rain
