

Remarks on Board the Bark Linn. Sailing off Tutuila
Thursday, June 20th

20. This Day began with fine weather and a strong breeze from the E. Ship steering in for the land under close reefed top-
" Sail: at 8 A.M. we hauled a back the Jm Dard and cleared
" away the Starboard Boat and started for the shore. At
" 11 we started off again with another Boat load of fruit.
" Dams: after getting our Dinner we started in again
" and got a boat two miles to the leeward of the landing
" place: and then we had to pull up again: After we
" landed we all went into one of the Huts and began
" to sing songs to the natives and they were very much
" pleased with it: as far as we could judge from their
" actions. at 4 P.M. we started in the ship with two Boats
" full of fruit: and nine natives besides. after getting on
" board we squared away and went off for the Columbia
" (which spoke us while the Captain was ashore: and has
" been laying a back all day for the Ala Man to land)
" at 6 P.M. we cleared away the Starboard Boat and the
" Ala Man went on board of her so ended this Day of
" our Exploits at Tutuila. Good Night to all.

Friday, June 21st

21. This Day began with stormy weather and a strong breeze from the E. Ship steering by the wind under short full standing in for the land to in order to get clear of the natives that are on board of it: at 8 A.M. we started from the ship with two Boats loaded with live stock and at 8 1/2 passed the Heads and landed the natives and came off again to the ship and had to go ashore again to carry the Ala Man into another place on shore where the Canoe lay: and stopped a little while and then started off again for the ship. Tomorrow we are again to go ashore again to trade and also find a place to anchor the ship for the purpose of getting wood and water. we calculate to run about a week from tomorrow and get all our recruits and then start for the Line. Watch employed scrubbing ship and a few other small jobs about deck so ended this Day after some rain and a full ashore in the long Boat to see the natives Good night to all

Remarks on Board Bark Linn Sailing off and on at Tutuila. P.M.
Saturday June 22nd

22. This Day began with Cloudy weather and a strong breeze from the E. Ship steering by the wind in for the landing. at 11 1/2 O'clock A.M. we loosed away the Starboard Boat and the Captain, two natives and a Boats Crew went ashore to carry some trade and also to find a good place to anchor the ship (a week from today we are coming in after food & water) and put a log down so we may know where to let go the ship's anchor. after doing all that we went ashore and stopped half an hour: then came off again to cruise around the island for a week after having got on board: I washed my clothes as usual: and the rest of the crew were employed scrubbing the Boat work. at 4 P.M. called the watch and so ended this Day among the Savages of the S. Sea Islands

Sunday June 23rd

23. This Day began with stormy weather and a strong breeze from the E. Ship steering P.M. Watch employed Reading & this morning the third watch rung out for a match in towards the land we kept the ship off and then hauled a back under after breakfast: but seeing no more of it we traced forward again and stood in our course. this afternoon nothing particular has occurred so ended this Day Latitude 14.02 Long 151.10 W

Monday, June 24th

24. This Day began with Cloudy weather and a strong breeze from the E. Ship steering N. at 9 A.M. we raised Phalaris and the ship Columbia's Boats were fast in our down to them and loosed away our Boats but owing to a squall that came up at the time the Whales got started and were going to the windward. Eyes out our Boats came on board again. the Columbia's Boats all got run away with after being fast several hours and had to cut

Tuesday June 25th

25. This Day began with Cloudy weather and a light breeze from the E. Ship steering full and by. Watch employed at work on the Rigging. Making Spun Yarn &c. this morning the Boats from the Columbia returned to the ship with the Whales after laying by him all night: and are cutting him in today at 4 called the watch and cleared up Deck so ended this Day after some rain: no Whales yet
