

Remarks on Board Bark Linn Laying at Bay of Island

Thursday, February 27th

This day begins with fine weather and a strong breeze from the E. Ship Linn at anchor. This morning we commenced making out the list and continued it all day. At 5 P.M. we cooked off and got supper. After supper I went ashore and spent the evening with the Thursday Girls. After leaving we fell in with the mate of the Napoleon, Mr. Becker. Mr. Cain and we went in for a good time and got on board at about 8 A.M. so ends this day, all well and in good spirits.

Friday, February 28th

This day begins with fine weather and a light breeze from the E. Ship Linn at anchor. This morning we began making out again and the first boats we started fetched away and took the second mate Lg. we then went ashore after the old man and after getting on board we took him ashore to Dock Street where he is to remain until he recovers. This afternoon there was a man buried from the Hercules. This evening there are two boats coming in but as yet we have not learned their names. The Eugenia also came in this afternoon. We also heard that the mate of the Eugenia had lost his wife so ends this day.

Saturday March 1st

This day begins with fine weather and a strong breeze from the E. Ship Linn at anchor. This morning before breakfast Jack Reynolds, Chas. Chas. myself went on board the Sea Lion to see Jimmie the Mount Washington Martha came in last night. I got Capt. Thomas to let him go ashore and stop all day with me. This afternoon we went after Cuckoys and got back about supper time so ends this day, all well.

Sunday March 2nd

This day begins with fine weather and a light breeze from the E. Ship Linn at anchor. This morning I went ashore and got the old man and after breakfast went ashore and staid all day. I saw Miss Mary on shore. This evening Jimmy came on board of us and spent the evening.

Monday March 3rd

This day begins with stormy weather and a light breeze from the E. Ship Linn at anchor. This morning we sent our oil on board the Napoleon to go home. This afternoon Jim was ashore and staid until supper time then he went to his ship and I to the Sea

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Tuesday, March 4th

This day begins with fine weather and a light breeze from the E. Ship Linn at anchor. This morning I went in after the old man. He also got off a raft of water before breakfast and finished it on deck. After breakfast the two Brothers handed inside of us. This morning I was ashore with Mr. Trapp. This afternoon was sun cloudy and I went on shore and staid until supper time. Jimmy was at St. George's to see me to day. Hatch employed stowing off the hold. Good night to all and my best wishes.

Wednesday March 5th

This day begins with cloudy weather and a light breeze from the E. Ship Linn at anchor. This morning I went ashore and staid with Mr. Trapp. At 8 A.M. I went off on board the Sea Lion with Jimmy to see the mate to set the signal (in honor of Capt. Jones who was again to be married) after coming on shore we went up to the wedding. This afternoon I went on board the Maria and staid to tea; after which I went ashore and staid until 10 P.M. About 9 P.M. we all started to persuade the Bridal Pair. But after going from one end of the town to the other we found they had taken their flight to some other part of the island and that ends our day's toil.

Thursday, March 6th

This day begins with fine weather and a light breeze from the E. Ship Linn at anchor. This morning the Maria handed in along side of us. At 5 P.M. I went on shore to see Mr. Trapp and staid with him until noon. Then the dog came and took my place. This afternoon Jim and I went up to see the Thursday Girls. This evening he and I had tea together all the time: until I came on board for the night. O. the Rain does come in this evening and there is another ship outside, which will come in tomorrow.

Friday, March 7th

This day begins with fine weather and a light breeze from the E. Ship Linn at anchor. This morning I went ashore and staid all the forenoon with the second mate. This afternoon I went ashore and staid until 4 P.M. when I went on board the Martha to carry a man belonging to her. After coming back and getting supper I went ashore again and staid until 11 P.M. when I fetched the old man off and turned in. Good night.
