Wednesday Aug 5thLat 37 00 N
Long 40 45 W

Light northwesterly breezes hazy steering
O.C. commenced trying but middle & latter
part light air cooled down about 5 1/2
o'clock made 3000

Thursday Aug 6thLat 36 14 N
Long 40 30 W

Light northwesterly breezes hazy steering
O.C. middle part steering O.C. latter part
northeasterly breezes shortened sail & stopped
to wind at sunset ship heading S
grampoids in sight

Friday Aug 7thLat 36 08 N
Long 40 17 W

Light southeasterly breezes with squalls of
rain by the wind on starboard tack middle
part northeasterly breezes steering O.C.
latter part the same saw white water
& grampoids

Saturday Aug 8thLat 36 00 N
Long 39 30 W

Light northwesterly breezes pleasant
steering O.C. middle & latter part the same
grampoids in sight

Sunday Aug 9thLat 35 51 N
Long 39 41 W

Light northwesterly breezes pleasant
steering O.C. middle & latter part the same
latter part southeasterly breezes heading
S several merchantmen in sight steering
to S by E

S. Fisher Master cruising on Western ground

Monday Aug 10thLat 35 25 N
Long 39 25 W

Strong easterly breezes with rain squalls
by wind on port tack picked at 6 am
again O.C. for merchantman in sight
middle part pleasant hauled at 12 am
heading northeasterly latter part the same
one sail in sight

Tuesday Aug 11thLat 36 04 N
Long 39 30 W

Light northeasterly breezes pleasant by the
wind heading to S & one sail in sight
middle and latter part the same
one sail in sight

Wednesday Aug 12thLat 36 12 N
Long 35 59 W

Light northeasterly breezes pleasant by the
wind on starboard tack one sail
in sight middle & latter part the same
saw grampoids two sails in sight

Thursday Aug 13thLat 37 00 N
Long 36 48 W

Light northeasterly breezes pleasant
by the wind on starboard tack
middle & latter part the same
spoke the Steamer of Salem Capt
Richmond 2 months out & can
had seen whales once

Friday Aug 14thLat 36 40 N
Long 37 12 W

Light northeasterly breezes pleasant
steering O.C. three sail in sight
middle & latter the same spoke
the Rosa Baker of Boston Capt
saw grampoids
