cutting at 6.20 all in got supper and set the watch
middle part squally head W & engaged clearing
decks Weather part moderate southwest
breeze on the northern tack at 12 am backed
to W & two Merchant sail in sight to
windward

Wednesday June 2d. Fresh breeze at 3 P.M. by N. N. E.
under double reef at 10 P.M. more lift N. N. E.
Middle part light westerly breeze gone to E. by N.
 Latter part moderate easterly breeze baffling
and squally on the Port tack. Charted the
works at daylight one sail in sight.

Thursday June 24

Thursday June 3d Light southwesterly breeze. Pleasant
weather steering up at 4 PM. wind to S.W.
Middle part light southerly air going aback
on but back heading to the gazette. Water
part moderate northwesterly breeze & squally
breeze. We saw Blackish War 12 05 PM.

 S. steering from N to S. W. the Alaska
 heading to S. W. Lat 43° N
 Long 124° 04' W

 Light brighting leaves from 11 to 12
 heading south westerly at 11 AM. backed to 10 &
 light the part with 1000 ft. westerly breeze from
 10 & backed to 11 at 11 AM. westerly breeze from
 same backed to 12 at 11 AM. westerly breeze from
 ahead which proved to be the Alaska aboriginal
 at 4 30 PM

banded light sails at 7 Pm spoke the Bk. It
