

Remarks on Board *Ok. Runbeam* S.

Thursday June 10th Light baffling breeze from
 S.W. to N.W. heading southwesterly at 7 P.M.
 heading N.W. over neighbor of ice flow on the
 southern tack. Middle part through the same
 water part fresh southwesterly breeze and
 squally heading to S.W. over neighbor of ice
 beam saw porpoises Lat 41 18 N
 Long 122 20 W

Friday June 11th Moderate southeasterly breeze steering
 different courses from S to N.W. Middle part
 light airs steering N.W. Water part light airs
 and calms over neighbor of ice Lat 41 42 N
 Long 122 15 W

Saturday June 12th Light southerly breeze steering
 S.W. to N.W. for our neighbor at 4 P.M. spoke the
 Alaska, Capt. C. went on board a few minutes
 Middle part light northerly airs steering
 N.W. Water part nearly calm slowed
 down 20 Kts. off our neighbor in sight
 Lat 41 50 N
 Long 122 10 W

Sunday June 13th Light airs & calms heading
 southwesterly Middle part baffling airs
 Water part light southwesterly breeze and
 squally heading southeasterly. Saw white water
 did not make it out too still in sight - no
 observation.

Monday June 14th Fresh northerly breeze with heavy
 squalls of rain and get light sails. A merchant
 ship off Spassag, bow steering with us Middle
 part light baffling airs from N.W. to S.W. Water
 part moderate breeze from S.W. to N.W. on
 western tack at 11 A.M. looked to S.W. our
 neighbor still in sight great quantities of
 drift wood in sight

Tuesday June 15th Light southwesterly breeze and
 overcast heading from S.W. to N.W. Middle
 part light northerly breeze steering N.W. Water
 part moderate southerly breeze steering from N.W.
 to N.E. heading out & cooping out our neighbor
 out of sight Lat 41 45 N
 Long 121 17 W

Wednesday June 16th Light breeze at S heading N.W.
 Pleasant weather all day employed breaking
 out & showing down oil Middle part light airs of
 baffling Water part much the same finished
 showing down on starboard side commenced
 breaking out the Port side but had to stop on
 account of rain

Thursday June 17th Moderate baffling breeze with
 much rain heading southwesterly Middle part
 light southwesterly breeze heading from N.W. to S.
 Water part moderate breeze commenced working
 in the hole at 11 P.M. school heavy squalls of wind
 and rain so ends this day

Friday June 18th Light baffling breeze & overcast weather
 heading southwesterly at 4 P.M. raised a school of
 whales overboard their spouts did not fasten upon us going
 to astern at 6 P.M. boats came on board shortly
 after had a heavy squall of wind & rain from
 N.W. steering S.W. under double reef Middle part
 light baffling airs at 11 P.M. heading southwesterly
 Water part much the same commenced working
 on the oil again Lat 42 27 N
 Long 122 17 W
