

Remarks on board Bk. Hunbeam B. Fisher

Wednesday June 1st

Light southeasterly breeze baffling
reading eastward at 4 1/2 pm finished stowing
down washed up decks & got supper the Captain
Debes in the weather from the side part light air
at 1 1/2 pm steering S by E latter part light northerly
breeze steering from S by E to N by E land
in sight

Lat 1 46 N
Long 122 15 WThursday June 2nd

Light northeasterly breeze steering
S by E at 4 pm veered southwesterly heading
from S by E at 6 pm veered to S by E
Middle & latter part light air & calms
heading westward

Lat 1 04 N
Long 122 05 WFriday June 21st

Light air & calms heading
westward Middle part light breeze at 11
breeze S by E latter part baffling air & calms
heading northwesterly saw grasshoppers &
porpoises

Lat 1 45 N
Long 121 52 WSaturday June 22nd

Light westerly breeze, hazy S by E
at 5 pm veered suddenly to S by E fresh breeze
with some rain under dunder. Middle
part moderate breeze at S by E steering S by E
at 2 pm veered to S by E latter part light air
and calms at 10 am light northerly breeze
off Cape Ponce steering N by E & S by E
the Macassar straits no observation saw a
Pinback

Sunday June 23rd

Light breeze at N by E and veered
steering S by E Middle part baffling air
latter part veered southward hazy & S by E in the
mouth of Macassar straits

Master On Macassar Straits off Samar del

Thursday June 24th

Light northwesterly breeze fine weather
hazy S by E about 1 30 pm raised a school of 10
whales off the quarter going to windward quick
at the side of Commodore distance about 15 miles
shortly after lowered the boats about 3 pm lower
boat hastened soon after the Commodore & Macassar
boats turned them up and got them along side
about 8 pm and got supper third vessel southward
choicely part getting ready for cutting on the starboard
lark hearting all hands to latter part fish
breeze at 5 pm heave all hands and commenced
cutting three foot 100 whales at 12 am all in got
dinner no observation

Friday June 25th

Moderate southeasterly breeze fine
weather hazy N and N by E clearing the decks about
6 pm got supper and started the work Middle part
much the same latter part light southeasterly breeze
heading to westward at 8 am veered to S by E at 12 am
weather looking squally

Saturday June 26th

Light breeze at N by E hazy S by E & squally
at 7 pm squalls from S by E heading southwesterly
Middle part light baffling air latter part light southeasterly
breeze made all sail at 10 am saw sperm whales
lowered 4 boats cool down & ended these 24 hours chasing
whales

Sunday June 27th

Light breeze at N by E hazy S by E at 5 pm
all the boats on board S by E got a small whale
Middle & latter part light baffling air boiling at
daylight hooked on at 7 pm both whales in gun sperm
whales ahead got breakfast & lowered three boats at 10
am had 5 whales turned up & ended these 24 hours
working to windward after dead whales of Samar del
Isle distance 40 miles
