Sunday Oct 17th

Light airs and calms heading
southward Middle part
light southeasterly breeze back
and U.S. Fish Com. porpoises in sight

Monday Oct 18th

Light baffling breeze from
S.W. S. heading to westward at
8.30 looked to S.W. at 9 pm looked
to S.W. Middle part heading southeasterly
breeze with some light rain from
S.W. and U.S. Fish Com. porpoises &
calms Blackfish porpoises & grampuses
in sight

Tuesday Oct 19th

Light southeasterly breeze
fine weather from S.W. Middle part
light northerly breeze steering S.W.
Middle part moderate southeasterly
breeze heading southward Fish Com.
in sight

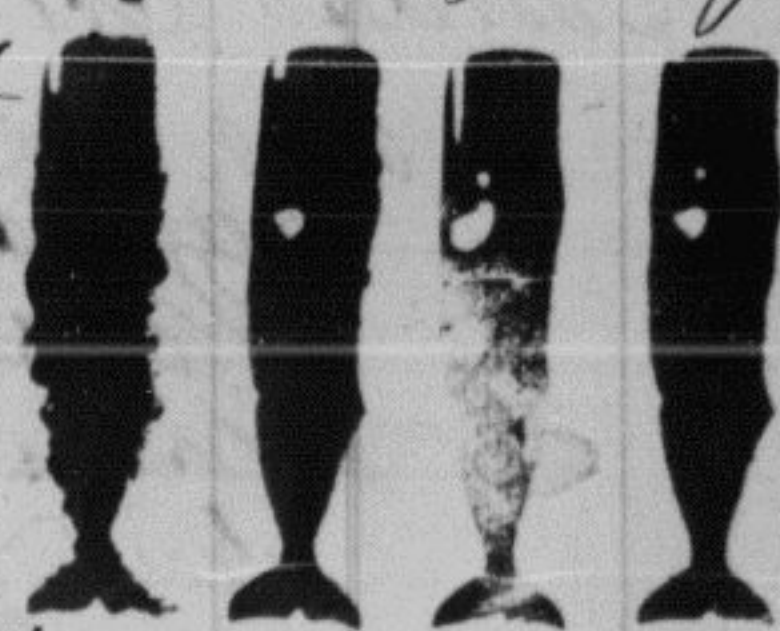
Wednesday Oct 20th

Light airs and calms
with heavy showers & rain Middle
part light northeasterly steering southeasterly

Off Waigolano raised a school of Pham whale off
starboard, tow about 3 miles off at
8 am lowered the boats. Observed
this day. whallings

Master in the M. Curca Passage off Waigolano
Thursday Oct 21st

Boats still in pursuit with
light baffling airs. About 2 pm
Phantom boat fastened. About
after the other later. All killed that
fish and commenced towing to ship.



About 7 pm all made fast alongside.
Got supper and set the watch. Middle
part getting ready for cutting. Master part
calm at 8 am called all hands and
commenced cutting at 10.30 am all in
and began clearing decks

Friday Oct 22nd

Light baffling airs all hands
employed clearing decks. At 4 pm started
the work. Middle part light northerly
breeze with some rain. Master part
northeasterly breeze heading eastward

Saturday Oct 23rd

Began with light northeasterly
breeze fine weather heading northwesterly.
Middle part much the same were
by 9 am Master part light southeasterly
heading southeasterly at 9 am finished
boiling grampuses and U.S. Fish Com. in sight

Sunday Oct 24th

Light southeasterly breeze
fine weather steering S.W. at 6 pm
steering S.W. Middle part
light northerly breeze heading N.W. & W.
Master part light northeasterly
breeze by 11.30 am. Saw Blackfish
