

## Remarks on board Rk. Cunbeam P.

Sunday Apr 10th

Begins with moderate northwesterly breeze and fine weather. At 5 pm. hauled into land hauled off hup 800 lb. at 6 pm. hauled a rigging part the same hauled off shore. Gutter part sent the cable and got the anchors off the bar. Working in for Mena harbor.

Monday Apr 11th

Begins with light northwesterly breeze and fine weather. At 1 pm. same to anchor in 8 fathom water off the spot mentioned. Gutter part employed breaking out & setting up the shooks for water.

Tuesday Apr 12th

Fine pleasant weather employed setting up shooks.

Wednesday Apr 13th

Fine weather. The Bark Joseph & Agnew leaving off and on 18 months out with 65 lbs. ball ball etc.

Thursday Apr 14th

Begins with fine weather employed mending. Gutter part. Overboard watch on liberty.

Friday Apr 15th

Gutter part. Overboard watch came on board and the watch went on liberty and breeze all day.

Saturday Apr 16th

Overcast. Overboard watch on liberty finished painting the knuck.

## Fisher - Master. On Menequa passage.

Sunday Apr 17th

Fine weather. Overboard watch on liberty.

Monday Apr 18th

Pleasant weather. Gutter part. Overboard watch came on board except three men. Supposed to have deserted. Setting off seawards.

Tuesday Apr 19th

Fine weather until the latter part some rain. Ready for sea. The three men still missing.

Wednesday Apr 20th

Begins with fine northwesterly breeze off shore with rain. At 4 pm. weighed our anchor and started. Of some rain & rigging & Gutter part light and variable breeze started the cable.

Thursday Apr 21st

Begins with light northwesterly breeze and pleasant weather steering S by E. At dark some squally off the land steering S by E. Middle & Gutter part light and variable breeze steering steering S by E. Hinting boats.

Friday Apr 22nd

Begins with light northwesterly breeze and pleasant weather steering S by E. At dark shortened sail steering along the land & minute part the same at 10 pm. hauled off shore hup 800 lb. at 12 pm. stood in shore. Gutter part hauled into land started S by E. A Malay schooner in sight. Employed painting boats.
