

Remarks on board Rk. Dunham St.

Saturday June 18th

Begins with light southeasterly breeze and pleasant weather steering N by E. About 11 am raised 3 whales off the bow heading to westward at 2 pm we passed the boat about 3 pm, the bow boat fastened shortly after the other two. At 3.30 pm we both outboard and 4 whales made fast. The other boat in chase of whales at 8 pm returned without further success. Middle part of day getting ready for cutting. Latter part of day making and making at daylight commenced cutting at 10 am whales in.

Sunday June 19th

Begins with variable air employed chasing whales. At 5.30 pm finished and washed off decks, light southeasterly breeze, by 6 pm middle part light southeasterly breeze heading southeasterly at 12 pm lashed to by 8.30 pm latter part light southeasterly breeze by 9.30 pm.

Monday June 20th

Begins with light southeasterly breeze by 8.30 pm at 6 pm the weather darkened the clouds. Middle part squally about 12 pm finished boiling. At 6 pm part moderate northeasterly breeze with some rain heading southeasterly.

Tuesday June 21st

Begins with light easterly breeze and rain by 8.30 pm at 6 pm northeasterly breeze steering N. Middle part the same, latter part overcast by 8.30 pm. Lat 5.03 N

Wednesday June 22nd

Begins with light northeasterly breeze and overcast by 8.30 pm. Middle part the same at 1 pm wind veered to E. moderate breeze with much rain steering to under double reef. Latter part more moderate made all sail.

Thursday June 23rd

Begins with pleasant breeze at 8.30 am started to run the Island of San Juan. Employed procuring oil to store. At dark hauled about 15 miles off luffed to off shore by 8.30 pm handed light sail. Middle part moderate breeze at daylight began to break out. Fore and aft side to starboard steering. At 8 pm saw a schooner in shore steering for us. No observation.

Friday June 24th

Begins squally with rain finished steering off E. side. At 3 pm spoke the schooner Heyon of Provincetown Capt. Baldwin 20 months old 300 lbs. Oil. At 4 pm Capt. B. came on board. Shortly after shut in thick so he stayed all night. Middle part strong breeze with much rain under double reef. Hauled up heading to E. Had run of each other light during the night. Latter part fresh breeze at 11 pm parted company steered to E. Heyon also steered off.

Saturday June 25th

Begins with light breeze at 8.30 am steering E. overcast & drizzle at dark shortened sail. Middle part headed to E. E. rain.
