

Remarks on board Bk. Plunkam B. Fisher

Tuesday July 3rd

Begins with light airs and calms.
Off Cape Sigeon at dark light
keeps at a light breeze at middle
part southeasterly breeze steering
to better part quite squally. At
sail in sight off Cape New

Wednesday July 4th

Begins with light, squally
breezes and fine weather. At about
2 PM speaks the Bk. Washburn
middle part the same. Better part
battling airs and calms.

Thursday July 5th

Begins with battling airs
and calms heading northward.
Middle part light easterly breeze
better part light southeasterly breeze
with some rain steering to Cape Washburn
off Port quarter heading about the
same.

Friday July 6th

Begins with light and battling
breezes steering to Cape Washburn.
Cape Washburn. Middle part
strong northwesterly breeze with rain
better part light breeze at Cape

Master cruising in Ches. Sea off Viri. Coast

Saturday July 7th

Begins with light breeze at Cape
steering to Cape in company with Washburn
at 4:45 PM saw the Washburn lower her boats for whales
and set colors at her main mast. We got our
boats into the water as soon as possible and pulled
for her boats. Got 3 whales. Plunkam 2 and Washburn
1 took 2 to Washburn and 1 to the Plunkam.

Better part light southerly breeze steering
to Cape at daylight cut in the whale. Washburn astun
cutting. At 11 AM she set colors for whales, shortly
after each vessel lowered their boats. Started
the work, hoisted out 3000 fms and cooled
down. Very hot weather heavy squalls of wind
and rain from Cape. Cape to Cape to Cape and
supposed to be the Joseph. Hapwell. The land
in sight bearing Cape 4.5 dist 18 miles. Proceeds
whaling in company with Washburn.

Sunday July 8th

Begins with fresh squalls of wind
and rain, boats to windward. At 4:45 PM all
boats on board. Washburn got a whale. Washburn
1 whale and 2 stown boats. At 5:45 PM began to
cut at the whale in. Washburn bearing Cape 4.5
cutting. At 7 PM started the work. Good weather
middle part the same. At daylight the land bore
to Cape. Better part southerly breeze heading
southeasterly. Washburn off her bow, also the
Joseph. Hapwell. Col'd the Washburn one of
our spare boats. Here to meet. Employed whaling.
