

Remarks on board Bk. *Chinbeam*. O.

Thursday Sept 9th

10 of Sept 14. Begins with light southerly
breeze and fine weather but 6th. Cat. 2 Pm
parted with Kathleen as pleased to go
Karey and she withward through
the passage. The two last mentioned vessels
still in sight. Wind still light westerly breeze
strong. 6 P. Batter part light southerly
breeze and squally steering 1 Pm. No. 3
bearing about 6 dist. 3 miles. One sail
in sight.

Friday Sept-10th

Sept-15th Begins with light southeasterly breeze and fine weather heading northwesterly at 2 pm rains at 4 pm wind veered northwesterly steering to the merchant Brig in sight steering southward & middle part. Fine northwesterly breeze with squalls of wind and rain heading southwesterly. Bottom part light breeze made all sail.

Saturday Sept 11th

Apr. 11th 1844
Beginning with moderate
westerly breeze from V^r & off V^r
at 2 Pm lost sight of our neighbor at 3 Pm
and a squall from V^r with some rain
beating northwesterly. Middle & Batten
past about the same. Lar 1. 04. R

Sunday Sept 12th

Sept 12th Begins with light southwest breeze and fine weather breaking unpleasantly. Middle part light southeast breeze but with W. Batten part baffling high and calm. Roma mountain in sight bearing about S. W. Lat 189 N Long 125.82 W

Monday Sept 12th

Begin with heaving air
and calms. at dark light W. wind
air temp 61° by J. L. Smith & G. A. S. S. S.
part of day - no. 1000000. began steering
southwest by different courses east coast
of Oahu in sight -
Lat 10.02 N
Long 125.10 W

Tuesday Sept-13th

Beginning with moderate
northeastern breeze and fine weather
steering P.M. by N. At dark shortened
sail and luffed to C/P - a head
and, latter part, the same at 9 P.M.
luffed to wind by N. & at 5 am was
W. by N.

Lat 0 44 N
Long 125 00 W

Wednesday Sept: 14th

Begins with moderate
northeast breeze and fine weather
steering P.M. at 2 P.M. luffed to wind
by 3 P.M. shortened sail at dusk.
Widdle and Gutter fast the same
at 4 P.M. rose to P at 4 A.M. rose to S at 7
Hemia mountain bearing about S by W.

Thursday Oct 10th

Begin with light - east side
keeps steering S by E for 10 miles at 6 PM
wind veered suddenly to S by E by 7 PM
moderate breeze (W) but light - southern ship
breeze - bright moonlight along the land at
daylight - came about 30 miles distant. Later part
bettering & employed getting anchors off the bow
and washing ship outside.
