Wednesday July 5th
Begins with light breeze at 5 P.M. and pleasant weather steering S.W. by E. about 1.30 long signalize our neighbor found it to be an American at 4 P.M. spoke her it proved to be the clipper ship Bertha of Baltimore. 8 P.M. from S.W. by E. at sunset our neighbor in sight off weather. Latter part weather continues about the same. Our neighbor in sight off weather. Lat 26.28 P Long 00.44 P

Thursday July 6th
Begins with light southeasterly breeze and pleasant weather steering S.W. by E. at 8 P.M. wind veered to S.W. middle part light all fine air and calm. Latter part continues about the same. Lat 22.55 P Long 00.58 P

Friday July 7th
Begins with light baffling air and calm at 5 P.M. took a light westward breeze by 9 P.M. by the bolt of our neighbor in sight off deck. Lat 21.35 P Long 1.12 P
Middle part continues about the same at daylight one of our neighbor off weather from 8 miles. The other out of sight to leeward. Latter part wind veered to S.W. by E. steered S.W. by E.

Tuesday July 8th
Begins with light breeze at 5 P.M. and pleasant weather steering S.W. by E. at dusk wind veered to S.W. moderate breeze. Our neighbor holds about the same middle part goes equally at daylight our neighbor in sight from masthead off weather cleared. Latter part fresh breeze. Lat 17.23 P Long 2.20 P

Wednesday July 9th
Begins with moderate southeasterly breeze and pleasant weather steering S.W. by E. middle part steady at 12 P.M. steered S.W. by E. Latter part wind veered to S.W. splendid weather. Lat 17.23 P Long 5.06 P

Thursday July 10th
Begins with moderate southeasterly breeze and fine weather steering S.W. at 8 P.M. wind began to keep back in studding sails at 7 P.M. equally handed light sails. Middle part fresh breeze with equally at 2 P.M. buffed to wind and doubled up by 5 P.M. at 8 A.M. saw the Island of St. Helena bearing about S.W. by E. at daylight steered S.W. by E. for 100 leagues. Lat 11 and 12 the light. Lat 11.15 on shore for letters. Blue whaler Bk. China and several merchant vessels at anchor. To wind off an m.

Friday July 11th
Begins with fresh S.W. Lat 14.33 P
Trades with light signalize her (land) Long 8.06 P
Sail returned about 4 P.M. with 6 P.M. made sail and lost our dearest friend steering S.W. by E. No merchant men in sight. Middle part moderate breeze at daylight 4 sail in sight. Latter part fresh breeze with equally steering S.W. by E.
