All of these 24 hours fine weather the first part the wind from S.S.E headed up E by N and E.S.E. at daylight saw a Brig steering E.S.E. All employed in ship duty at 5 pm tried the pumps and found the ship tight at sundown the weather continues fine Steered S.E. by E

All of these 24 hours fresh breezes and clear weather wind from E.S.E ship heads up S by W all employed in ship duty at sundown the weather continues clear with fresh breeze

The first of these 24 moderate breezes from E.S.E headed up S by E. and S. the middle and latter part strong breezes from the same quarter at sundown double reefed the topsail saw pumps so ends these 24 hours
