Nov 24 The first part of these 24 hours strong Gales from the N.W. steered W.S.W. at 8 am double Reefed the topsail set the mainsail and took in the jib. Split the fore topsail unbent it and bent a new fore topsail the latter part strong Gales with Rain from the N.W. took in fore top sail close Reefed the main topsail and shankers so ends

Nov 25 The latter part of these 24 hours fine clear weather with light breezes from the West to N. and N.W. Steered by S. saw finbacks all employed in ship duty so ends

Thursday
Nov 26 The first part moderate Gales and clear weather from the N.E. steered W by S saw nothing the latter part strong Gales from N to N.W. with Rain close Reefed the topsails hauled the jib and mainsail at 6 pm wore ship so ends

Friday
Nov 27 All of these 24 hours strong Gales from the S.W. at daylight split the fore topmast stay sail unbent it and bent a new one the latter moderate and clear set the fore top sail and courses at 2 pm bent a new shanker and set the jib saw Porpoises so ends

Saturday
Nov 28 The first part of these 24 hours moderate made all sail with the wind N.W. saw Porpoises all employed in ship duty the latter part fresh breezes singal Reefed the top sails at 3 am wore ship at sundown pump ship we find the ship leaks in the upper works some

Sunday
Nov 29 The first part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the N.W. steered W by S cloudy saw finbacks and Porpoises the latter part strong Gales and Rainy squally weather took in the jib and mainsail at sundown more moderate set the jib and mainsail again so ends

Nov 30 The first part light air and cloudy made all sail steered west with the wind from the East saw a Grate number of finbacks at 9 am took the Landward Boat in on deck the latter part strong breezes from the North with Rain at 2 pm saw a fin seal at sundown pump ship find her Bottom tight so ends

Dec 1 The first of these 24 hours strong Gales from the W.S.W. with Rain and fog the latter part light breezes and clear weather made all sail. Saw Porpoises so ends

Wednesday
Dec 2 The first part light air from the Eastward Steered W by S saw Porpoises all employed ship duty the latter part fine clear weather with the wind N.W. steered W.S.W. at 2 pm saw a dead blackfish saw Porpoises and struck 2.

Thursday
Dec 3 The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the N.W. steered W.S.W. saw Porpoises the middle part strong Gales from the N.W. with fog steered S.W. at 1 pm Reefed the top sails the latter part clear moderate weather made sail

Dec 4 The first part strong breezes from the Westward steered S.W. by S. saw finbacks all employed in getting out water at 9 am tacked ship and took in the main top Gallant sail at 11 double Reefed the top sails the latter strong Gales from the South with a large swell from the S.W. took in the main sail at 6 pm took in the fore top sail and Pump ship so ends

Saturday
Dec 5 The first part strong Gales from the South at midnight tacked ship the middle and latter part moderate made sail clear weather the wind West Steered South saw nothing at 6 pm wore new heel Ropes and Pump ship so ends

Dec 6 All of these 24 hours light air and calm with clear weather wind from the Eastward Steered South saw Wargans so ends
